Directors,

Thank you for your outstanding support, flexibility and response over the past week in regard to the changing Executive Order (EO) reporting requirements.

The EO Crisis Action Team (CAT) is working to automate, streamline, and reduce the number of reporting periods currently required of the Field.

For today's 0500 and 1500 (EST) reports, please use the existing template and submit via email. It will not be necessary to submit a 2100 report today.

Beginning Saturday, February 4, 2017, Field Offices will only need to submit stats twice daily via SharePoint, as shown on the attached revised templates.

Guidance for use of revised templates:

The EO CAT has created a page on the Incident Management Division SharePoint site.

Beginning Saturday, February 4, 2017, reports must be submitted via the site:

(b)(7)(E)

in the "Revised EO Reporting 24 HR Period" file.

Starting Saturday, February 4, 2017, reports must be submitted via SharePoint by 0001 (EST) and 1200 (EST).

Each Field Office (FO) must submit the name(s) of FO points of contact (POC) for reporting. The POCs will be granted access to the SharePoint site. It is imperative that the spreadsheets are provided timely and accurately. POCs should ensure the date and time on the submission is modified once the information has been submitted. POC names must be forwarded to the EO CAT NLT 1300 (EST) February 3, 2017.

A consolidated "Waiver Request" file is also available via the SharePoint site. This spreadsheet has tabs for details about travelers encountered. Included is a tab for DFO/SES PD considered exceptions, Refugees, Canadian Landed Immigrants, EO affected aliens encountered without identity documents. The spreadsheet must be filled out completely, to include country of citizenship, how the subject presented themselves, the final disposition and high level bullets in the appropriate column.

For any EO waiver exceptions granted by a Director of Field Operations, Port Director, John F. Kennedy Airport or Port Director, Los Angeles International Airport, please include bullets listing the country of citizenship of the subject, how the subject presented themselves and the final disposition. If a waiver is denied, please provide an explanation.

In regards to withdrawals (WD) tab, please only report on aliens granted I-275 WD who actually depart the United States or are referred to Enforcement and Removal Operations. Do not report pending aliens, or those granted an EO exception. For each withdrawal, please include bullets regarding the reason for the withdrawal and the type of admission intended (i.e.; B1/B2, etc.).

In accordance with the February 1, 2017 White House Guidance, Sections 3(c) and 3(e) of the EO do not apply to Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR) returning to the United States. <u>LPR information should not be captured on the spreadsheet.</u>

Please keep in mind that the **(b)(7)(E)** mailbox is for internal operational use only and is not to be provided to individuals or components outside of CBP.



Luego de que el presidente Donald Trump firmara una orden ejecutiva que promueve el veto a inmigrantes, la confusión en los fronterizos ha crecido ante el temor de que se les quite su visa al intentar ingresar a Estados Unidos.

Esto debido a que en los últimos días han estado circulando afirmaciones en redes sociales de que agentes del Departamento de Aduanas y Protección Fronteriza (CBP) están quitando visas a los extranjeros que crucen de noche.

"Eso es una mentira, nosotros no estamos quitando las visas por cruzar tarde. Hay tiendas que abren toda la noche y su visa de turistas les permite cruzar a comprar a la hora que sea", comentó Rubén Jáuregui, vocero de CBP en El Paso.

Aunque agregó que es verdad que se han quitado visas, el vocero negó que sea una "cacería" contra extranjeros y que sólo se trata de decomisos por "mal uso".

"Siempre le hemos quitado visas a la gente que hace mal uso de ellas. Por ejemplo, cuando alguien con visa de turista quiere vivir, trabajar o estudiar en Estados Unidos se las quitamos, porque la (visa) de turista obviamente no es para nada de eso", dijo Jáuregui.

Temor en redes sociales

Ante la incertidumbre, los fronterizos han externado sus preguntas a través de Facebook, donde algunos usuarios manifiestan que se trata de una "orden contra mexicanos", pero otros creen que "depende del *migra* que te revise".

Personas como Silvia Cueto aseguran tener conocidos quienes ya perdieron la visa por estas medidas.

"A mi amiga le quitaron el viernes su visa, que porque ya eran las 10 de la noche y era tarde para ir de compras", manifestó la mujer.

Por su parte Jáuregui contestó que este tipo de comentarios en redes sociales sólo causan "paranoia" entre la gente, pero aseguró que nada es verdad.

"Todos dicen que al primo del abuelito del tío de la vecina le pasó, en realidad nadie conoce a nadie y sólo se dejan llevar por lo que dice la gente", comentó el vocero.

Las revisiones 'son las mismas'

Ante las largas filas que se han registrado en los últimos días, Jáuregui descartó que se deban a que los agentes sean más "estrictos".

"Las revisiones son exactamente las mismas, lo que pasa es que más gente está cruzando a cargar gasolina y de compras", dijo.

Jáuregui pidió a la comunidad no dejarse llevar por comentarios de redes sociales, ya que considera que solamente causan "temores" innecesarios.

They cross by gasoline and slow down the bridges: CBP

After President Donald Trump signed an executive order that promotes the veto of immigrants, confusion at the border has grown in the face of the fear that their visa will be taken away when they attempt to enter the United States.

This is because in recent days there have been circulating statements in social networks that agents of the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) are removing visas for foreigners crossing at night.

"That's a lie, we're not taking away visas for crossing late. There are stores that open all night and their tourist visa allows them to cross to buy at any time, "said Rubén Jáuregui, a spokesman for CBP in El Paso.

Although he added that it is true that they have removed visas, the spokesman denied that it is a "hunt" against foreigners and that it is only about seizures for "misuse".

"We have always taken visas from people who misuse them. For example, when someone with a tourist visa wants to live, work or study in the United States we take them away, because the tourist visa is obviously not at all, "said Jáuregui.

Fear in social networks

Faced with uncertainty, border people have expressed their questions through Facebook, where some users say that it is an "order against Mexicans", but others believe that "it depends on the mig that checks you."

People like Silvia Cueto claim to have acquaintances who have already lost their visa for these measures.

"My friend took her visa on Friday, because it was 10 o'clock at night and it was late to go shopping," said the woman.

Jáuregui replied that this type of comments in social networks only cause "paranoia" among people, but said nothing is true.

"Everybody says that the cousin of the grandfather of the neighbor's uncle happened to him, in fact no one knows anybody and they just let themselves be carried away by what people say," said the spokesman.

Reviews 'are the same'

Before the long lines that have registered in the last days, Jáuregui ruled that they are due to the agents are more "strict".

"The reviews are exactly the same, what happens is that more people are crossing to charge gas and shopping," he said.

Jáuregui asked the community not to be carried away by comments of social networks, since it considers that they only cause unnecessary "fears".
