The EO Crisis Action Team (CAT) is working to automate, streamline, and reduce the number of reporting periods currently required of the Field.

For today's 0500 and 1500 (EST) reports, please use the existing template and submit via email. It will not be necessary to submit a 2100 report today.

Beginning Saturday, February 4, 2017, Field Offices will only need to submit stats twice daily via SharePoint, as shown on the attached revised templates.

Guidance for use of revised templates:

The EO CAT has created a page on the Incident Management Division SharePoint site.

Beginning Saturday. February 4. 2017. reports must be submitted via the site:

Kennedy Airport or Port Director, Los Angeles International Airport, please include bullets listing the country of citizenship of the subject, how the subject presented themselves and the final disposition. If a waiver is denied, please provide an explanation.

In regards to withdrawals (WD) tab, please only report on aliens granted I-275 WD who actually depart the United States or are referred to Enforcement and Removal Operations. Do not report pending aliens, or those granted an EO exception. For each withdrawal, please include bullets regarding the reason for the withdrawal and the type of admission intended (i.e.; B1/B2, etc.).

In accordance with the February 1, 2017 White House Guidance, Sections 3(c) and 3(e) of the EO do not apply to Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR) returning to the United States. <u>LPR information should not be captured</u> on the spreadsheet.



It is the policy of the United States to protect its citizens from foreign nationals who intend to commit terrorist attacks in the United States; and to prevent the admission of foreign nationals who intend to exploit United States immigration laws for malevolent purposes.

As we push forward in our efforts to protect our Nation, OFO Operations will require daily reporting on our activities as related to this Executive Order. Reporting will include encounters in the air, land and sea environments with anyone who arrives into the U.S. from the seven (7) countries (Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen) that meets the criteria outlined in the Executive Order and the instructions issued to the field by Admissibility and Passenger Programs.



On January 27, 2017, President Donald Trump issued Executive Order: <i>Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States</i> . It is the policy of the United States to protect its citizens from foreign nationals who intend to commit terrorist attacks in the United States; and to prevent the admission of foreign nationals who intend to exploit United States immigration laws for malevolent purposes.			
As we push forward in our efforts to protect our Nation, OFO Operations will require daily reporting on our activities as related to this Executive Order. Reporting will include encounters in the air, land and sea environments with anyone who arrives into the U.S. from the seven (7) countries (Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen) that meets the criteria outlined in the Executive Order and the instructions issued to the field by Admissibility and Passenger Programs.			
Using the attached spreadsheet, data should be captured daily for the 24-hour time period beginning at 0300 (EST) – and ending at 0259 hours (EST). By 0500 hours (EST) daily, each Field Office is required to submit their data from the previous 24-hours to OFO Field Liaison (b)(7)(E) Reports must be submitting using the attached Microsoft Excel template document. Field Liaison will consolidate these reports into a final report senior CBP and DHS leadership.

Immigration advocates allege abusive immigration tactics used at El Paso port of entries

EL PASO, Texas (CBS4) — Local immigration advocates claim federal officials at El Paso ports of entry are using abusive tactics on green card holders from Mexico and Latin America.

President Donald Trump signed an executive order Friday to ban citizens from seven Muslim-majority countries from entering the United States.

Since then, protests against the travel ban have erupted across the country, including right in El Paso.

The Borderland Immigration Council and other immigration advocates said green card holders are reporting mistreatment.

The council said these people are being forced to sign I-407 forms when entering El Paso, which would end their residency.

But the council couldn't share details about how many reports its received or specifics, just that it is mostly Mexican families reporting.

What bridges this allegedly happened at is also unknown.

An advocate said signing I-407s is voluntary and they should never be forced into anything without talking to a lawyer.

"We need to remind people that they should not be forced to do that. It's very serious issue," said Linda Rivas with Las Americas Immigrant Advocacy Center.

A representative with Customs and Border Protection said the council had not reached out to CBP about the alleged abuse.

According to CBP.gov, "the U.S. Customs and Border Protection takes allegations of employee misconduct and discrimination very seriously. Allegations of misconduct or discrimination are referred to the CBP Office of Internal Affairs.

Personnel are specially trained to investigate and review allegations. If warranted, CBP will take appropriate action against the employee."

EL PASO, TEXAS - President Trump's executive order on a seven nation ban has created confusion amongst permanent lawful residents.

The order blocks citizens of seven Muslim-majority countries from entering the U.S. for 90-days and although it does not affect naturalized citizens, it does affect lawful permanent residents- those are people who have gone through the legal process to live and work in the U.S.

According to the Borderland Immigration Council, they're now hearing reports of lawful permanent residents being forced to sign a I-407 form, which once signed is a record of abandonment of the U.S. for lawful permanent residents.

The Borderland Immigration Council says El Paso has a large Muslim population that is being affected by this order at ports of entry.

"There is a hysteria right now surrounding this of potentially not being able to return or being forced to abandon residency and so, we are calling on CBP to please be clear with us on what their policies are," says Linda Rivas, executive director and managing attorney with the Las Americas Immigrant Advocacy Center.

Rivas says the reports they have been getting are not limited to Muslims, but Mexicans who are legal residents as well

"Going forward we are expecting it to get much worse those executive orders give tremendous amount of more power to CBP and there is no mechanisms for any type of transparency," says attorney Jessica Miles.

The Border Immigration Council advises lawful permanent residents crossing the border to not sign anything.

They say its better to call an attorney because signing a I-407 could jeopardize immigration status. cbp and there is no mechanisms for any type of transparency."

Reportan cancelaciones de residencia a mexicanos en puentes

El Consejo Fronterizo de Inmigración (BIC) afirmaron durante una conferencia de prensa que se han presentado algunos casos en donde agentes de los puertos de internacionales de El Paso han cancelado permisos migratorios a residentes legales permanentes (LPR).

La coalición esta compuesta por abogados migratorios y organizaciones sin fines de lucro de la ciudad, quienes buscan defender los derechos constitucionales de la comunidad migrante y alertar sobre la posibilidad de que se

este afectado a residentes fronterizos que cuenten con una 'green card'.

A partir del pasado 29 de enero, el presidente Trump firmó una orden ejecutiva con la que prohibía las entradas a migrantes nacionales de Irak, Irán, Libia, Somalia, Sudán, Siria y Yemen. La orden suspende además la admisión de refugiados musulmanes de los mismos países.

"Esta orden nos esta afectando a todos, hemos escuchado de dos reportes de personas de origen mexicano que son residentes y llegaron al puente y los hicieron firmar un formulario I-407", dijo Melissa López, directora ejecutiva de Servicios Diocesanos para Migrantes y Refugiados.

El formulario I-407 del Servicio de Ciudadanía e Inmigración de Estados Unidos (USCIS), es un documento de 'Abandono de Estatus de Residente Permanente' con el cual un individuo renuncia a su residencia legal en los Estados Unidos.

"Aun no conocemos los detalles exactos por que nos estamos comunicando con las personas afectadas, pero esto nos preocupa mucho por que estamos viendo ahora que nos esta afectado en la frontera", comentó.

La coalición le sugiere a aquellos que ha contado con un permiso de residencia por años, que no duden en tramitar la ciudadanía. "Es muy importante, ahora más que nunca, que apliquen para la ciudadanía", explicó López.

Adicionalmente, se alerta a todo fronterizo que haga uso constante de los cruces internacionales y si llegan a enfrentar problemas en los puentes, no firmar ningún documento que pueda afectar su estatus migratorio.

Por lo que indican que pidan el apoyo de un abogado migratorio o representante legal y en caso de ser detenidos, que pidan una audiencia con un juez. "Es importante que no firmen nada, ya que esto complica la situación para los abogados para tratar de salvar la situación", añadió.

El Diario de El Paso previamente había reportado que en los últimos días habían circulando afirmaciones en redes sociales de que agentes del Departamento de Aduanas y Protección Fronteriza (CBP) habían quitando visas a extranjeros que crucen de noche.

"Eso es una mentira, nosotros no estamos quitando las visas por cruzar tarde. Hay tiendas que abren toda la noche y su visa de turistas les permite cruzar a comprar a la hora que sea", comentó Rubén Jáuregui, vocero de CBP en El Paso.

Aunque agregó que es verdad que se han quitado visas, el vocero negó que sea una "cacería" contra extranjeros y que sólo se trata de decomisos por "mal uso".

"Siempre le hemos quitado visas a la gente que hace mal uso de ellas. Por ejemplo, cuando alguien con visa de turista quiere vivir, trabajar o estudiar en Estados Unidos se las quitamos, porque la (visa) de turista obviamente no es para nada de eso", dijo Jáuregui.

El vocero explicó que la agencia de CBP actualmente cuenta con cuatro programas para atender y responder a quejas por parte de la comunidad. Uno es el sistema de Representantes del Servicio de Pasajeros, las tarjetas de comentarios, el Centro de Información de CBP y un programa en el que los directores y supervisores de los puertos responden personalmente a las quejas telefónicas y verbales.

"Cualquier viajero que tiene un comentario o queja con respecto a su tratamiento durante el proceso de inspección, se le anima a que hablen inmediatamente con el supervisor de guardia o hablar con un gerente de servicio profesional. CBP sigue comprometido a tratar a todos los pasajeros con profesionalismo, dignidad y respeto, tratamos todas las quejas seriamente y se investigan a fondo", comentó el vocero a través de un comunicado.

Denuncian organizaciones promigrantes que las autoridades de EU están negando la entrada a los residentes que viajan seguido a Juárez; se

les pide además renunciar a su residencia

La orden del presidente Donald Trump para cerrar la frontera a los refugiados y a ciudadanos musulmanes, ha estado afectando también a residentes estadounidenses que viven en Ciudad Juárez.

De acuerdo con Melissa López, directora de Servicios Diocesanos para Migrantes y Refugiados, se han recibido quejas de personas que son residentes de Estados Unidos y que viajan seguido a Ciudad Juárez, a quienes se les negó la entrada por El Paso y se les pidió firmar la forma para renunciar a su residencia.

López dijo que este fin de semana, luego de que se firmaron las acciones de Trump, no solo se ha afectado a musulmanes en distintos aeropuertos de Estados Unidos, sino también a los fronterizos que a diario usan los puentes internacionales.

"Hemos recibido reportes de que están quitando visas láser y hemos detectado abuso de los residentes de Estados Unidos que viven en Ciudad Juárez", dijo López.

Otro de los integrantes del Borderland Immigration Council (BIC), el abogado Carlos Spector, informó que de igual manera han encontrado quejas de personas que dicen que al entrar a El Paso les han pedido firmar una forma para abandonar su estatus de residencia.

"No firmen la i-407, es una forma que enseña que quieren abandonar el país y que nadie puede forzarlos a firmarlos, mucha gente va a ser presionada que porque lleva mucho tiempo fuera de Estados Unidos, pero eso no tiene validez", dijo Spector.

El abogado mencionó que, en el caso de que se encuentren en una situación similar, soliciten hablar con un abogado y que no firmen nada de los documentos que les presenten.

Fernando García, director de la Red Fronteriza por los Derechos Humanos (BNHR), dijo que se tienen que hacer cambios en las acciones ejecutivas de Donald Trump, ya que se encuentran mal redactadas.

"Uno de los ejemplos que podemos ver son la renuncia del director nacional de la Patrulla Fronteriza y del fiscal general, por no querer seguir e implementar las políticas que se habían firmado", dijo García.

Además mencionó que no es posible que los residentes americanos se encuentren en riesgo de salir del país y no poder regresar.

Las órdenes que se firmaron, y que tienen la prohibición de entrada por 90 días para ciudadanos de varios países de mayoría musulmana, dejaron en sus primeras horas varias personas detenidas en aeropuertos de todo el país.

Posteriormente, la decisión de Trump sufrió un paro por una corte federal al considerarse como ilegal.

Personal de aduanas y protección fronteriza dijo que se necesita saber nombre de las personas y la fecha de nacimiento, así como la fecha en la que se les intentó obligar a firmar la forma i-407.

Personal del BIC comentó que por el momento se está buscando obtener a personas que puedan y quieran hablar con los medios por temor a represalias migratorias.

Lideran mexicanos trabajo sin papeles

Aunque el flujo de migrantes mexicanos a EU ha disminuido, 52 por ciento de los trabajadores indocumentados en ese país son mexicanos, quienes se ocupan en la agricultura y construcción, principalmente, según un reporte de Pew Research Center.

En la Unión Americana existen 11.1 millones de inmigrantes sin papeles, según cifras de 2014, los cuales representan 3.5 por ciento del total.

El número más alto de inmigrantes de este tipo alcanzó su punto máximo en 2007 con 12.2 millones, cuando este grupo representaba 4 por ciento de la población total.

Pero la llegada de mexicanos a la Unión Americana se ha reducido desde la crisis de 2008, en contraste, la presencia de migrantes de otras regiones como Centroamérica y Asia, muestra un repunte en el mismo periodo.

Todos se concentran en seis estados

"La disminución de inmigrantes no autorizados de algunas partes del mundo, principalmente México, fue equilibrada por un aumento de inmigrantes de otras partes del mundo, por lo que la población total de inmigrantes sin papeles no tuvo cambios estadísticamente significativos de 2009 a 2014", señaló Pew Research Center.

Seis estados concentran a la población migrante sin papeles: California, Texas, Florida, New York, New Jersey y Illinois.

Pero entre 2009 y 2014, esta población disminuyó en siete estados (Alabama, California, Georgia Illinois, Kansas, Nevada y Carolina del Sur), debido a que se redujo la presencia de mexicanos en EU.

"Obama ya deportó a 2.5 millones de trabajadores, eso no es nuevo. El retorno disque voluntario de personas que dicen ya no querer estar en EU fue muy notorio en el quinquenio 2005-2010 y aumentó mucho después de la crisis porque los empleos donde se ocupaban los migrantes mexicanos cayeron mucho". señaló Alfredo Hualde, experto del Colegio de la Frontera Norte.


In addition if anyone has Facebook if you search the name (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (reporter from KDBC/KFOX) you can see a recording of a livestream of the press conference followed by a Q&A with one of the speakers at the end. It is about 35 minutes.
