Good afternoon,

Please see the below additional guidance as well as the attached issued to (b)(7)(E) floor operations personnel related to the Executive Order:

- **Dual nationals** - We are awaiting further clarification as DHS and DOS discuss how to approach this, so for now if you can articulate a traveler holds a passport from one of the 7 restricted countries, we will err on the side of caution and offload.
- **Advance Paroles** - are cleared to board (unless a TSDB), so if there is any question as to whether a returning refugee or asylee is coming back on an I-512, refer for document verification.
- **SIV travelers**, e.g. (b)(7)(E) are cleared to board barring any new derogatory information since issuance.
- **1st Time Refugees** - regardless of citizenship are not cleared to board unless they have been cleared through FBI's (b)(7)(E)
- **Returning Refugees and Asylees** - regardless of citizenship are to be denied boarding as they will require a waiver. If we catch well enough in advance, the waiver may be granted prior to travel, but our guidance right now is to offload these travelers.

[NBC News.com - White House Floats 20 Percent Tax on Mexican Imports to Pay for Border Wall](#)

NBC News reports President Donald Trump has not formally proposed a 20 percent tax on Mexican imports to pay for his controversial border wall and is instead considering it among a series of options, White House spokesman Sean Spicer said Thursday. "The goal today is not to be prescriptive. It's to basically say: Hey, here is a way in which the wall can be paid for extremely easy and not say 'this is what we're doing,'" Spicer told reporters. "This is not what we're rolling out."

[CNN.com - Mexican president cancels meeting with Trump](#)

CNN reports Mexican President Enrique Peña Nieto on Thursday canceled a meeting with U.S. President Donald Trump that had been set for next week after renewed tensions erupted over Trump's plan to build a wall on the border. "This morning we have informed the White House that I will not attend the meeting scheduled for next Tuesday with the POTUS," Peña Nieto tweeted.

[Biometric Update.com - Trump's executive order on immigration addresses biometric entry-exit tracking system](#)

Biometric Update reports President Donald Trump signed an executive order Wednesday which includes a series of initiatives to address immigration, including a proposal to establish a national biometric ID program for non-citizens entering and leaving the U.S., according to a report by Payments Source. According to a draft

executive order leaked to civil rights advocates and obtained by The Washington Post, one of the measures of the executive order calls for an “Expedited Completion of Biometric Entry-Exit Tracking System”. Section 8 of the executive order draft reads: “The Secretary of DHS shall expedite the completion and implementation of biometric entry-exit tracking system for all travelers to the U.S., as recommended by the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks upon the U.S.”

[Federal Soup.com - CBP gets personnel boost in executive order](#)

Federal Soup reports following through on his campaign promise to tackle immigration, Donald Trump has issued an executive order outlining his immigration plan, which includes a boost in personnel for one federal agency. CBP will need to hire 5,000 additional Border Patrol agents as part of the executive order issued on Jan. 25. The order also states that all necessary action must be taken by the CBP commissioner to “ensure that such agents enter on duty and are assigned to duty stations as soon as is practicable.”

[Washington Post.com - Draft executive order would begin ‘extreme vetting’ of immigrants and visitors to the U.S.](#)

Washington Post reports the Trump administration plans to start vetting would-be immigrants and visitors to the United States based partly on their opinions and ideology, and will immediately cease the resettlement of Syrian refugees in the United States, according to a draft executive order leaked Wednesday to civil rights advocates and obtained by The Washington Post. The order, if enacted, would signal the beginning of the “extreme vetting” that President Trump promised on the campaign trail, as well as partial implementation of the “Muslim ban,” according to civil rights advocates.

USA TODAY reports thanks to TSA PreCheck, Global Entry and a variety of other programs that pre-vet travelers, 12 million people are now eligible to access the expedited screening lanes at U.S. airports. But even with increased TSA staffing levels and the addition of automated screening lanes at some airports, many trusted travelers still end up waiting in long lines to get their IDs checked by TSA before they can even gain access to the expedited lanes.

[Tucson.com - More drug profits slipping into Mexico as border seizures plummet](#)

Claudia Zuniga Aguilar’s daughter needed braces, so she decided to smuggle drug profits into Mexico for a cartel. The Chandler resident was caught with \$9,998 in her purse and wallet as she drove through the Nogales port of entry on March 15, U.S. District Court records show. Zuniga Aguilar, 45, told customs officers she picked up the cash from a man in a Costco parking lot in Mesa. She was supposed to deliver it to an ice cream shop in Sonora in exchange for the down payment on her daughter’s orthodontia. The seized money was just below the \$10,000 cash reporting requirement, a tool used by CBPO’s to prevent illicit cash smuggling. But as Zuniga Aguilar’s case shows, CBP officers also can seize any amount of money if they believe it’s the result of illegal activity.

[Star Herald.com - U.S. Senator Deb Fischer seeks details on immigration information collection](#)

Star Herald reports U.S. Senator Deb Fischer (R-Neb.) today sent a letter to DHS Secretary John Kelly asking for details about the new administration’s plan to collect information on immigrants entering and exiting the country. In the letter, Fischer asks three specific questions regarding the administration’s efforts to keep our country safe by establishing a comprehensive biometric entry-exit system.

Information found in social media may be used to review ESTA applications to validate legitimate travel, adjudicate VWP ineligibility waivers, and identify potential threats.

"CBP remains committed to protecting the privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties of all travelers. CBP will handle the voluntarily-provided social media identifiers in the same manner as other information collected through ESTA and has documented these procedures in the newly updated System of Notice Records Notice and Privacy Impact Assessment available at dhs.gov/privacy."

If you and your management team haven't done so already, please reach out to your counterpart ERO FODs, CBP DFOs, and CBP Port Directors in your AOR to let them know that we are ready to assist if needed in anticipation of 1,200 refugees scheduled to arrive in the US shortly (according to DOS). We will be getting further guidance later this afternoon. Below FYI from New York Chief Counsel is info on a lawsuit regarding two Syrians and others similarly situated, who were detained at JFK.

"ERO Newark reports that CBP at JFK is no longer seeking bed space. CBP Commissioner granted a waiver on the released Syrian and the Secretary is reviewing a waiver on the remaining detained Syrian."

Darweesh v. Trump, No. 17-0480 (EDNY filed Jan. 28, 2017): On January 28, 2017, named petitioners Hameed Khalid Darweesh (whom the New York Times reports has been released from government custody) and Sameer Abdulkhaleq Alshawi filed a habeas petition and complaint for declaratory and injunctive relief on behalf of themselves and "all others similarly situated." The petitioners allege that their detention pursuant to the January 27, 2017 Executive Order (EO) that, among other actions, suspended the issuance of visas to people from seven countries, "violates their Fifth Amendment procedural and substantive due process rights, and is ultra vires the immigration statutes. Further, Petitioners' continued unlawful detention is part of a widespread pattern applied to many refugees and arriving aliens detained after the issuance of the" EO. The petition alleges that the named petitioners and putative class members "has been detained and questioned by CBP officials, denied entry to the United States, and subject to the threat of return to the country from which their travel originated, regardless of their presentation of valid entry documents, their status in the prior country, and possible claims qualifying them for protection under 8 USC 1101(a)(42) [defining "refugee"] and 8 USC 1225(b)(1)(A)(ii) [applicants for admission with claims of asylum]." Petitioners allege that the EO violates: their Fifth Amendment due process rights to apply for asylum and for withholding/CAT protection; various provisions of the INA that entitle them to apply for asylum withholding and CAT relief; the Foreign Affairs Reform and Restructuring Act of 1998; their Fifth Amendment equal protection rights because it discriminates against them on the basis of country of origin and "was substantially motivated by animus toward—and has a disparate effect on-Muslims..."; and the Administrative Procedure Act, because the EO is arbitrary, capricious, an abuse of discretion, contrary to constitutional power, ultra vires, and procedurally infirm. The relief sought is a writ of habeas corpus for each petitioner and class member; an injunction "ordering Respondents not to detain any individual solely on the basis of the EO;" a declaratory judgement that the detention of the petitioners and class members is unauthorized; costs and attorneys' fees. The petitioners' lawyers are from the Yale Law School, the Urban Justice Center, the National Immigration Law Center, the ACLU and the New York City law firm of Kilpatrick Townsend & Stockton. The respondents are President Trump, DHS, CBP, Secretary Kelly, CBP Acting Commissioner McAleenan and CBP's New York Field Director, James T. Madden.

In an accompanying motion for class certification, "Petitioners ask this Court to certify a class consisting of all individuals with refugee applications approved by [USCIS] as part of the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program, holders of valid immigrant and non-immigrant visas, and other individuals from Iraq, Syria, Iran, Sudan, Libya, Somalia, and Yemen legally authorized to enter the United States, but who have been or will be denied entry to the United States on the basis of the January 27, 2017 Executive order."

Please see the below additional guidance as well as the attached issued to (b)(7)(E) floor operations personnel related to the Executive Order:

- **Dual nationals** – We are awaiting further clarification as DHS and DOS discuss how to approach this, so for now if you can articulate a traveler holds a passport from one of the 7 restricted countries, we will err on the side of caution and offload.
- **Advance Paroles** – are cleared to board (unless a TSDB), so if there is any question as to whether a returning refugee or asylee is coming back on an I-512, refer for document verification.
- **SIV travelers**, e.g. (b)(7)(E), are cleared to board barring any new derogatory information since issuance.
- **1st Time Refugees** – regardless of citizenship are not cleared to board unless they have been cleared through FBI's (b)(7)(E)

- **Returning Refugees and Asylees** - regardless of citizenship are to be denied boarding as they will require a waiver. If we catch well enough in advance, the waiver may be granted prior to travel, but our guidance right now is to offload these travelers.

Effective January 27, 2017, and in accordance with the new Executive Order, Protecting the Nation from Terrorist Attacks by Foreign Nationals, signed by President Trump, all citizens and nationals of; Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen will not be allowed admission into the United States for the next 90 days under Immigration Nationality Act (INA) section 212(f).

This guidance applies to all citizens; non-immigrants, first time immigrants, and refugees from the seven restricted countries. This excludes United States citizens, Lawful permanent residence (LPR), and foreign nationals traveling on A's diplomatic visas, North Atlantic Treaty Organization visas, C-2 visas for travel to the United Nations, and G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4 visas or certain diplomatic visas issued by Department of State.

A new User Define Rule (UDR) has been put into production today, January 27, 2017, at 2000 hours, to help identify citizens of the seven restricted countries traveling to the United States. Once a hit is identified and the traveler identified to be a citizen of one of the seven restricted countries listed. The **(b)(7)(E)** will be responsible to inform the Lead Targeter who will notify CWC/WC, conduct full research to determine if the subject is inadmissible pursuant to 212(f) of the INA, and will be set up for offload or referral will be made to the port of entry advising of the inadmissibility, unless the traveler is identified to be excluded under the above exception.

Special Humanitarian exception is available at the Secretary of Homeland's discretion, all requests for Humanitarian exception will be directed to the XD, DXD, and Director of **(b)(7)(E)** through your chain of command. Unless the Director or Assistant Director of **(b)(7)(E)** has granted boarding permission, no boarding will be authorized.

 - First time refugees.
 - Remaining in-scope categories – C1 approval required. Delegation request to DFOs is currently with the S1. We hope to have today.
- (b)(7)(E) are doing a great job to identify in-scope travelers and deny boarding. (b)(5)
- (b)(5) We continue to push at all levels.
- Issued WD guidance based on court order.

- Crewman that are now lacking a valid visa and are determined to pose no additional concerns to the security of the United States may be detained on board the vessel, with an approved security plan, for the duration of the vessel's U.S. voyage. Crewman that pose a concern to the security of the United States should be ordered removed under safeguard pursuant to standard operating procedures. Removal requires OCC review and concurrence to ensure Court order compliance.
- C1, C2, EAC Owen, etc., continue to work through a prioritized list of Congressional calls.
- We're working with Department of State to align our EO policies and protocols with additional changes expected soon.
- We'll have FAQs posted via CBP website and a public inquiry call center established later today.

The EO Crisis Action Team (CAT) is working to automate, streamline, and reduce the number of reporting periods currently required of the Field.

For today's 0500 and 1500 (EST) reports, please use the existing template and submit via email. It will not be necessary to submit a 2100 report today.

Beginning Saturday, February 4, 2017, Field Offices will only need to submit stats twice daily via SharePoint, as shown on the attached revised templates.

Guidance for use of revised templates:

The EO CAT has created a page on the Incident Management Division SharePoint site.

Beginning Saturday, February 4, 2017, reports must be submitted via the site:

(b)(7)(E)

in the "Revised EO Reporting 24 HR Period" file.

Starting Saturday, February 4, 2017, reports must be submitted via SharePoint by 0001 (EST) and 1200 (EST).

Each Field Office (FO) must submit the name(s) of FO points of contact (POC) for reporting. The POCs will be granted access to the SharePoint site. It is imperative that the spreadsheets are provided timely and accurately. POCs should ensure the date and time on the submission is modified once the information has been submitted. POC names must be forwarded to the EO CAT NLT 1300 (EST) February 3, 2017.

A consolidated "Waiver Request" file is also available via the SharePoint site. This spreadsheet has tabs for details about travelers encountered. Included is a tab for DFO/SES PD considered exceptions, Refugees, Canadian Landed Immigrants, EO affected aliens encountered without identity documents. The spreadsheet must be filled out completely, to include country of citizenship, how the subject presented themselves, the final disposition and high level bullets in the appropriate column.

For any EO waiver exceptions granted by a Director of Field Operations, Port Director, John F. Kennedy Airport or Port Director, Los Angeles International Airport, please include bullets listing the country of citizenship of the subject, how the subject presented themselves and the final disposition. If a waiver is denied, please provide an explanation.

In regards to withdrawals (WD) tab, please only report on aliens granted I-275 WD who actually depart the United States or are referred to Enforcement and Removal Operations. Do not report pending aliens, or those granted an EO exception. For each withdrawal, please include bullets regarding the reason for the withdrawal and the type of admission intended (i.e.; B1/B2, etc.).

In accordance with the February 1, 2017 White House Guidance, Sections 3(c) and 3(e) of the EO do not apply to Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR) returning to the United States. LPR information should not be captured on the spreadsheet.

Please keep in mind that the (b)(7)(E) mailbox is for internal operational use only and is not to be provided to individuals or components outside of CBP.
