

BECOMING A LICENSED CHILD CARE PROVIDER



Are you, or someone you know, interested in becoming a licensed child care provider?

Check out the information below to identify your state's requirements and learn more about how to become a licensed and/or regulated childcare provider.



While regulations vary by state, some of the topics you can find resources on through ChildCare Aware of America and ChildCare.gov are listed below:

- The differences between regulated care types (for example: licensed child care centers and registered family child care homes)
- The approving authorities in your area (including but not limited to your state Office of Child Care, your city fire department or other local agencies)
- Physical requirements for the facility, regulated areas of care, and how-to's for posting license and registration information
- Program requirements for indoor and outdoor activities that are appropriate to the children's ages, needs, and capabilities
- Codes, regulations, background investigations, and discipline procedures
