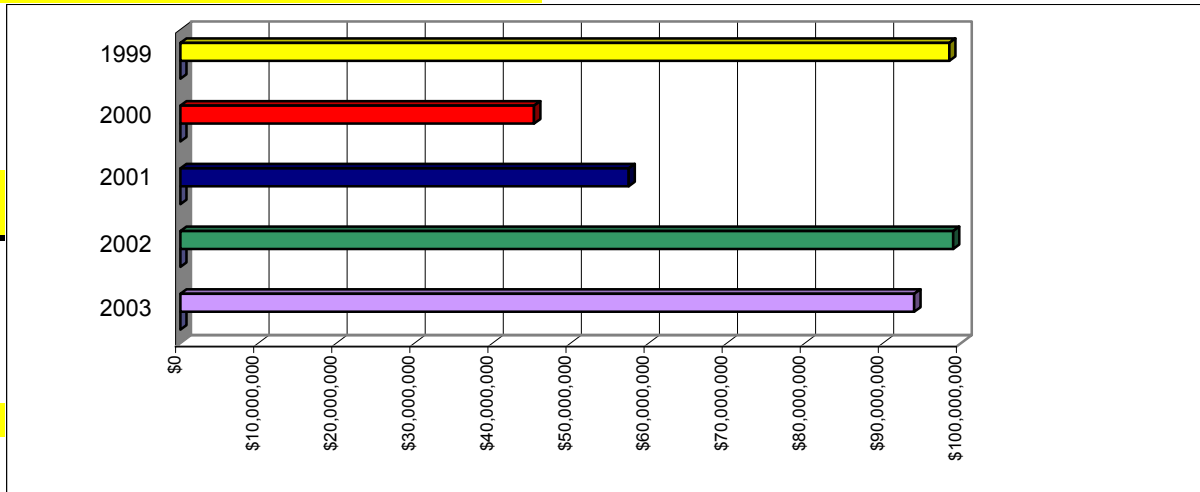

## Comparison of Yearly Domestic Values of IPR Seizures

The value of IPR seizures in FY 2003 decreased 5% from FY 2002, but was the third highest domestic value in the history of Customs/Department of Homeland Security.

## Comparison of Yearly Seizure Totals

The seizure total reflects a 12.2% increase in the number of seizures from fiscal year 2002 to 2003, and an increase of 81% from FY 2001. 6,500 is the highest number of IPR seizures in Customs/Department of Homeland Security's history.
