Razor wire on Texas river border hinders agents, endangers migrants

EAGLE PASS — Razor wire put up by the state of Texas along the Rio Grande is blocking border patrol agents from reaching at-risk migrants — including families with infants and unaccompanied children — and increasing

the risk of drownings, according to a Customs and Border Protection document obtained by Hearst Newspapers.

The warning is a new sign of escalating tension between state and federal officials over Gov. Greg Abbott's border security program, Operation Lone Star, and it comes as the governor is putting a wall of buoys in the river despite concerns from immigration advocates that it will further endanger migrants.

"Currently there is no path forward if DPS continues to deploy the concertina wire," says the document, which is dated June 26 and appears to be out of the agency's Eagle Pass Station.

The state has strung wire along much of the Rio Grande near Eagle Pass, a section of the border that has seen a surge of Venezuelan and Cuban migrants over the past year. It has gone up across gates that border patrol uses to quickly reach the river, according to the document.

The wire is preventing agents from getting to asylum seekers, some of whom have said they have been stuck in the river for hours and days, exposed to the elements with little to no help from Texas Department of Public Safety officers, according to the document.

Migrants are now traversing the banks of the river along spools of thick, sharp wire, increasing the chance of drownings, the document warns. And with water levels rising and some of the wire placed inside the river and not visible, there is a "high risk" of injury, it says.

The document was dated just days before four migrants, including an infant, drowned in the Rio Grande near Eagle Pass. Officials have not said the wire played a role in the drownings. A Texas DPS spokesman has said the migrants were found floating along the river by state officials on July 1.

The Texas Department of Public Safety, meanwhile, has effectively shut down key designated areas that CBP identified as staging points to get asylum seekers out of the elements, including extreme heat, and process and transport them to detention centers, the document says.

CBP did not respond to multiple requests for comment on the memo. Neither did Abbott's office nor DPS. In response to a request for the full document, CBP officials said the records were "not under the purview" of the agency.

Just days after CBP appeared to raise internal concerns about the proliferation of wire along the riverbank, a Fox News reporter tweeted footage of a border patrol agent cutting through it to get to migrants along the river. In response, the agency told Fox News that a border patrol boat had encountered a group of migrants with several small children and had to cut through the wire to get them out of the heat.

Texas has been under heat advisories for much of the summer with temperatures in the triple digits for weeks.

The struggle over the wire is the latest example of the diverging approaches on the border taken by the Biden administration and Abbott since the end of Title 42, a COVID-era public health order that was used to immediately turn away most asylum seekers, in May. Federal officials have said border crossings have plummeted since the order was lifted, though CBP has not yet released official data for June.

Abbott has been deploying razor wire in Eagle Pass since 2021, blaming the Biden administration for not doing more to stop migrants from crossing the border. Abbott said at a press conference in May that he's having to add more troops and razor wire because of "the chaos caused by Joe Biden lifting Title 42."

"Texas is doing everything possible to stop people from crossing the border," Abbott said.

The Biden administration, meanwhile, has returned to longstanding immigration law, which requires border patrol agents to apprehend migrants that are on U.S. land, rather than immediately turn them away. They are then processed to either move forward with asylum claims or to be removed from the country. It is part of a broader White House border strategy that includes expanding legal pathways to enter the country, coupled with harsher consequences — including a five-year ban on entry and possible jail time — for those who do not follow them.

The White House did not respond to a request for comment on the wire.

The concertina wire has long been part of Abbott's Operation Lone Star, often installed on private land with the permission of landowners.

Poncho Nevárez, a former Democratic state representative from Eagle Pass, said he allowed the Texas National Guard to put wire up on his land more than a year ago and is "about to ask them to take it off."

Nevárez said that soon after the wire went up, he found a 17-year-old pregnant girl who had made it through to his land, barefoot and crying, carrying a three-year-old child.

"Right off the bat, we saw how ineffective it was," said Nevárez, a former chairman of the House's Homeland Security & Public Safety committee.

Nevárez said the video of the border patrol agent cutting the wire illustrates what federal agents are facing now.

"The border patrolman is dealing with the fact that, 'I have to apprehend them. I'm not going to cut myself up or have them get cut up by having them go across the concertina to get to me,'" he said. "If you're the landowner, are you good with leaving them on the bank of the river indefinitely?"

U.S. Rep. Joaquín Castro, a San Antonio Democrat, said Abbott has gone too far and is "interfering with border patrol's ability to do its job and to save people's lives." He said the razor wire is already dangerous and now the state is putting barriers in the water that will make the situation worse.

On Monday, Abbott put a barrier of buoys and netting into the Rio Grande to block migrants from crossing from Mexico into Texas despite legal challenges to the plan.

Experts have also warned that the move may infringe on a 1970s treaty with Mexico that manages river access. The treaty requires any levees or barriers from El Paso to Brownsville to be signed off by both the U.S. and Mexican governments.

Attorneys for an Eagle Pass kayak outfitter, meanwhile, are seeking an emergency meeting with a judge in Travis County to impose an injunction against Abbott to stop deployment of the 1,000-foot barrier that human rights groups said could lead to more drownings. Human rights groups have said the buoys, which have webbing below that also prevents people from swimming under them, will do little to stop people from trying to cross the river and only make the route more dangerous.

DPS Director Steven McCraw said in early June that the goal is not to harm anyone.

“We don’t want anybody to get hurt,” McCraw said. “In fact, we want to prevent people from drowning. And this is a proactive way.”

Since October, border officials have reported over 268,000 encounters in the Del Rio sector, making it the second-most crossed section of the entire border from Brownsville to San Diego.

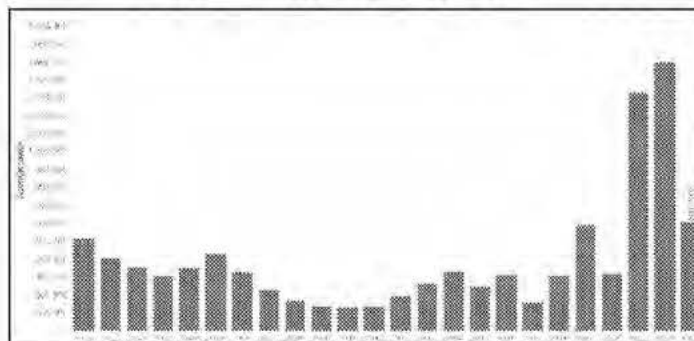

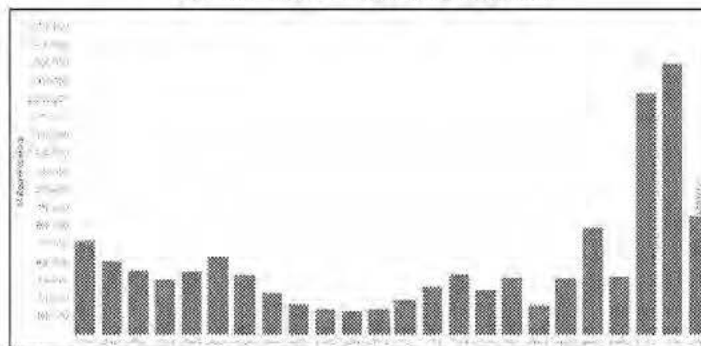

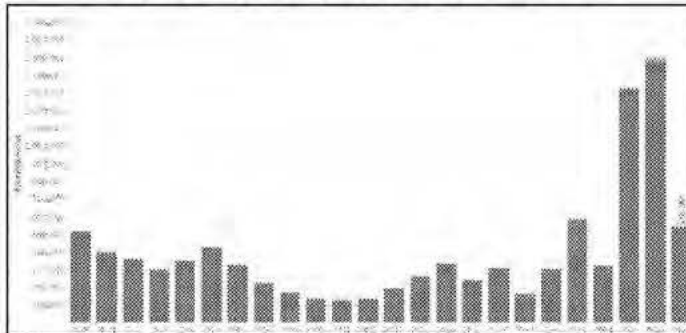
