# Hours of Service for Entrance and Clearance

Inspection services for the entrance/ arrival of aircraft at Francis S. Gabreski Airport are available 7 days per week, 1000-2200 in accordance with the port's permission to land procedures.

Commercial aircraft operators departing the U.S. must obtain an outbound clearance by contacting CBP directly.

#### **Permission to Land Procedures**

Pilots must secure permission to land by contacting CBP by email at <a href="MRW@cbp.dhs.gov">MRW@cbp.dhs.gov</a> prior to departure from the foreign airport and at least 24 hours in advance of the anticipated arrival time at KFOK (absent extenuating circumstances).

Permission to land is granted with a tolerance of (+/-) 30 minutes. If your ETA deviates outside these parameters, previously granted permission(s) are invalid and you must contact the CBP port to re-secure permission to land.

### **Inspection Process**

- The KFOK Control Tower will direct all foreign aircraft to be processed at the CBP facility.
- CBP Officers will meet the aircraft on the ramp to begin inspection and no passenger or crew member should depart the aircraft area prematurely.
- All crew and passengers will be brought into our facility to ensure that all CBP formalities and procedures are followed.
- Passengers will be advised to present their formal documents such as passports, visas and other necessary information to be processed.
- Crew will also need these documents as well as pilot's license, medical certificates, aircraft registration and user fee decal.
- Passengers can depart directly from the CBP facility at the conclusion of the inspection.

#### **Special Procedures/Miscellaneous**

- Permission to land is only granted by a CBPO via verbal or email confirmation.
- Passenger limit for general aviation aircraft may not exceed 20 passengers, unless prior approval has been given.
- Reimbursable Services (559/RSP) is approved for certain companies.
- Please advise CBP if your aircraft is transporting live animals, weapons, hunting trophies, prohibited food products and commercial imports or Carnets.
