



(b)(7)(E) A basic inspection of the subject's cell phone revealed a photograph of him wearing a military uniform bearing the insignia of Iran's Ministry of Defense Armed Forces Logistics (MODAFL), not the Artesh as he claimed. Open source information states MODAFL was added to the Specially Designated National list maintained by the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) on October 25, 2007, freezing its assets under U.S. jurisdiction and prohibiting transactions with U.S. parties which targets proliferators of weapons of mass destruction and their delivery systems. The U.S. Department of the Treasury indicates MODAFL manufactures Shahab-3 missiles and has brokered transactions involving materials and technologies with ballistic

missile applications. (b)(7)(E) Boston generated (b)(7)(E) for (b)(7)(E) yielding negative results. The subject was refused admission pursuant to sections 212(a)(7)(A)(i)(I) and 212(a)(6)(C)(i) of the Immigration and Nationality since he could not overcome the presumption of being an intending immigrant and was processed as an expedited removal.
