Subject expressed no fear to return to their country of residence. Subject was processed as an Expedited Removal per Chief CBPO **(b)(6)(b)(7)(C)** with concurrence from SCBPO **(b)(6)(b)(7)(C)**. This letter is in response to you (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) correspondence on behalf of (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) regarding her encounter and subsequent removal from the United States by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) at the George Bush Intercontinental Airport in Houston, TX on (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). CBP has recently completed a review of this matter; please allow me to outline our findings.

CBP is tasked with protecting our nation's borders as well as enforcing and administering hundreds of federal laws. All international travelers attempting to enter the United States, including all U.S. citizens, are subject to examination upon each arrival to this country. We rely on the patience, cooperation, and understanding of travelers to ensure the effective protection of our borders. Under U.S. immigration law, all non-citizens seeking to enter the United States as temporary visitors are interviewed by examining officers to confirm they are eligible for admission, including interview of possible intent to immigrate, which would also violate visa requirements. To enter the United States, the traveler must demonstrate they are a U.S. citizen or a non-citizen who has overcome all grounds of inadmissibility enumerated in section 212 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA). The applicant bears the burden of proof of admissibility. CBP endeavors to ensure that all applicants for admission are treated fairly, with dignity, and are inspected and examined in accordance with current laws, regulations, and court decisions.

After careful review (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was processed for expedited removal from the United States on (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) pursuant to section 235(b)(1) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), which includes a five-year bar from attempting entry to the United States. The charge under Section 212(a)(7)(A)(i)(I) of the INA, was found to be proper due to statements and evidence presented during the inspection and the finding that as an applicant for admission (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was unable to overcome the presumption of being an intending immigrant to the United States. As a result of this removal, a Form I-212, Application for Permission to Reapply for Admission into the United States after Deportation or Removal, must be filed and approved if (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) wishes to return to the United States during the five-year bar period, in addition to the appropriate U.S. visa for her purpose of entry.

In the future, we recommend that if at any time any of your constituents have concerns during CBP processing, they immediately request to speak to a Professionalism Service Manager (PSM) or supervisor on duty. A PSM or a supervisor is always available, responsive to the public, and they are the primary point of contact to address all concerns regarding the CBP process.

Thank you very much for confirming receipt of my email.

I went to the detention center yesterday and met with [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) again, who provided the attached I-867A&B (“transcripts”) signed by [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and Office [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). I would request you kindly review this decision at your earliest decision because **this is a groundless decision with no legal or factual basis.**

The decision quoted Section 212 (a)(7)(A)(i)(I) of the INA, regarding the documentation requirements for immigrants, stating on page 11: *“the reason for this action is because you cannot overcome the presumption of being an intended immigrant.”* No place in the transcripts mention [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) immigrant intent, which was not discussed during the interview at a [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) has no immigrant petition filed on her behalf or by her. **Hence, the decision has no legal basis or factual basis.**

Of the 11 pages of I-867A, about two pages were regarding [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and family members’ memberships in the Chinese Communist Party, of which Ms. Yu has never been a member. She honestly disclosed to Office [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) that she was a Youth League member, and she joined the Youth League at the age of 13, as the vast majority of Chinese teenagers who are all Youth League members. Being a member is not an inadmissible ground for an F-1 student.

The rest of the pages are about [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) research and her trip to Mexico. Please kindly note that the reason [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) travelled to Mexico to renew her F-1 visa, even though her current F-1 visa was valid till July 2022, is that her professor and Ph.D. advisor wanted her to attend an academic conference in Spain later this year and [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) wants to apply for a Schengen visa in the U.S., which requires that her F-1 visa must be valid at least 3 months beyond the intended departure from the Schengen Area. Otherwise, she will have to return to China to apply for the Schengen visa. The reason she used the visa agent to pay the visa application fee is because US consular posts require the application fees to be paid in cash and in person. Everyone in the U.S. who wants to apply for a US visa in Mexico must do so.

[REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) answered all of Office [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) questions truthfully and completely, while she was under the impression that the questions were biased from the beginning as they all seem to be related to being of Chinese origin such as her family’s membership in the Chinese Communist Party, and [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) chose a Chinese professor as her Ph.D. advisor among so many family professors at [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). The only wrong answer that [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) gave to Office [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was to his question whether she met someone in Mexico during the trip, because she misunderstood the question and thought Office [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) asked if she went to Mexico to apply for the F1- visa with someone else. **This is not a material information, and there was no reason for [REDACTED] (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to lie about this question.**

In essence, there was no factual basis supporting the issuance of this life shattering, career ending expedited removal order. I would therefore request you kindly review and rescind the order.

However, the consular officer returned her passport containing the above valid visa and specifically told her that doing so is to allow her to return to the U.S. pending the administrative processing so that she would not be stuck in Mexico. The consular officer also told her that the administrative processing could be completed in two weeks and she would be notified to return to Mexico to get the visa issued.

Hence, she had the proper immigration documents when she applied for admission. She mentioned that she misunderstood a question from the CBP Officer (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) about whether or not she had met someone in Mexico and mistakenly thought the question was about whether she went to Mexico to apply for the visa with someone. I believe she was telling the truth as her honesty and integrity were verified by her employer and colleague whom I met yesterday. Furthermore, even if the officer concludes this as misrepresentation, it was not about a material fact or information, and hence should not be a ground of inadmissibility.

To summarize, I could not determine on what factual and legal grounds the ER order was based, and would likely request you review the order.

I have been retained (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) a (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to represent (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who was issued an expedited removal order upon arriving at the IAH after travelling to Mexico to renew her F 1 visa. Please find my G28 attached.

- She has an F 1 visa issued 5 years ago and is valid ti (b)(6)(b)(7)(C)
- Her new F 1 visa application was required administrative processing. However, the consular officer returned her passport containing the above valid visa and specifically told her that doing so is to allow her to return to the U.S. pending the administrative processing so that she would not be stuck in Mexico. The consular officer also told her that the administrative processing could be completed in two weeks and she would be notified to return to Mexico to get the visa issued.

Hence, she had the proper immigration documents when she applied for admission. She mentioned that she misunderstood a question from the CBP Office (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) about whether or not she had met someone in Mexico and mistakenly thought the question was about whether she went to Mexico to apply for the visa with someone. I believe she was telling the truth as her honesty and integrity were verified by her employer and colleague whom I met yesterday. Furthermore, even the officer concludes this as misrepresentation, it was not about a material fact or information, and hence should not be a ground of inadmissibility.

To summarize, I could not determine on what factual and legal grounds the ER order was based, and would likely request you review the order.
