Hours of Service for Entrance and Clearance

Inspection services for the entrance/ arrival of aircraft at Baltimore/ Washington International Airport are available 7 days per week, 0600-2200 in accordance with the port's permission to land procedures. See Special Procedures below.

Commercial aircraft operators departing the U.S. must obtain an outbound clearance by contacting CBP directly.

Permission to Land Procedures

Pilots must secure permission to land by contacting CBP prior to departure from the foreign airport and at least 2 hours in advance of the anticipated arrival time at KBWI.

Permission to land is granted with a tolerance of (+/-) 30 minutes. If your ETA deviates outside those parameters, Previously granted permission(s) are invalid and you must contact CBP to resecure permission to land.

Inspection Process

- The FIS is not attached to the FBO or main terminal.
- A CBP Officer will meet the aircraft on the FOB to begin the inspection.
- Be prepared to present passports, visas, pilot's license, medical certificate, aircraft registration, and user fee decal (if appropriate).

Special Procedures/Miscellaneous

- No arrivals can be processed between the hours of 1230 and 1400 ET.
- Permission to land must be requested within the Port's operational hours of 0600-2100.
- The Port has limited staffing after 2100 hours, permission to land will be granted on a case by case basis.
- Advise CBP if transporting live animals, weapons, hunting trophies, or commercial imports.
