Past Actions. Past actions are those within the cumulative effects analysis areas that have occurred prior to the development of this ESP. The effects of these past actions are generally described throughout the previous sections.

Present Actions. Present actions include current or funded construction projects; CBP or other agency actions in close proximity to the vehicle fence locations; and current resource management programs and land use activities within the cumulative effects analysis areas. In addition, USBP might be required to implement other activities and operations that are currently not foreseen or mentioned in this document. These actions could be in response to National emergencies or security events like the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, or to changes in the mode of operations of the cross border violators.

Currently the TON has no proposed transportation projects; however, three development projects are ongoing or are recently completed. DHS EXERCISES WAIVER AUTHORITY TO EXPEDITE ADVANCEMENTS IN BORDER SECURITY

WASHINGTON – The U.S. Department of Homeland Security announced today its intent to issue two waivers of certain laws to expedite security improvements at the southwest border. Congress gave the Secretary of Homeland Security authority to waive all legal requirements necessary to expeditiously install additional physical barriers and roads at the border to deter illegal activity.

"Criminal activity at the border does not stop for endless debate or protracted litigation," said Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff. "Congress and the American public have been adamant that they want and expect border security. We're serious about delivering it, and these waivers will enable important security projects to keep moving forward. At the same time, we value the need for public input on any potential impact of our border infrastructure plans on the environment—and we will continue to solicit it."

One waiver applies to certain environmental and land management laws for various project areas in Calif., Ariz., N.M., and Texas, encompassing roughly 470 total miles. It will facilitate additional pedestrian and vehicle fence construction, towers, sensors, cameras, detection equipment, and roads in the vicinity of the border.

A separate waiver was signed for the levee-border barrier project in Hidalgo County, Texas. This roughly 22-mile project will strengthen flood protection in the area while providing the Border Patrol with important tactical infrastructure. In addition to environmental and land management laws, this waiver addresses other legal and administrative impediments to completing this project by the end of the calendar year.


A substantial portion of the project areas addressed by these waivers have already undergone environmental reviews. In those areas where environmental reviews have not yet occurred, the department will conduct a review before any major construction begins. The department remains deeply committed to environmental responsibility, and will continue to work closely with the Department of Interior and other federal and state resources management agencies to ensure impacts to the environment, wildlife, and cultural and historic artifacts are analyzed and minimized.

The department also places a high priority on interaction with, and feedback from, local officials, landowners and community members about border infrastructure project plans. Since May 2007, more than 600 individual landowners have been contacted and over one hundred meetings with local officials, public open houses and town halls have been held along the southwest border.

The department has used its discretionary waiver authority on three previous occasions. Certain environmental restrictions were waived on Sept. 13, 2005 to complete a roughly 14-mile stretch of fencing, as part of the Border Infrastructure System, near San Diego, California. A second waiver of environmental restrictions was used for additional border infrastructure near the Barry M. Goldwater Range in southern Arizona. on Jan. 12, 2007. A third waiver of environmental restrictions was issued on Oct. 26, 2007, allowing the construction of border infrastructure to move forward near the San Pedro National Riparian Conservation Area in southern Arizona.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How much of the environmental assessment process has DHS completed?

The environmental review process includes extensive consultation with state and local officials, landowners, and the public. Federal agencies – such as the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the U.S. Forest Service, and the International Boundary and Water Commission – are also included in the review process.

DHS has initiated the environmental assessment process on all pedestrian fencing projects. In fact, a substantial portion of the project areas addressed by these waivers have already undergone environmental reviews. In those areas where environmental reviews have not yet occurred, the department will conduct a review before any major construction begins.

We have made significant progress in the development of NEPA documents for these projects and have released draft Environmental Impact Statements and Environmental Assessments for public comment and held public open house meetings. The environmental assessment process has been initiated or completed on over one third of the vehicle fencing projects.

Q: What happens to the Environmental Assessment/Environmental Impact Statements that have been prepared?

Although the Secretary has exercised the waiver authority, DHS remains committed to building this tactical infrastructure in an environmentally responsible manner. Our environmental planning documents will continue to guide the projects.

DHS will continue to coordinate with local natural resource managers, tribes and state historic preservation officers. We will continue to identify the natural, biological and cultural resources potentially impacted by each segment of the project, determine best management practices (BMPs) and devise appropriate mitigations and accommodation measures.

Environmental stewardship plans will be developed and implemented for each border infrastructure segment project.

Q: Will concerns outlined in these environmental publications (documents) be addressed?

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Infrastructure location and design will be altered to minimize impacts wherever possible; where avoidance or minimization cannot be achieved, the Secretary is committed to executing reasonable mitigation measures for wildlife and habitat impacts.

In addition, the Secretary is committed to avoiding adverse impacts to historic and cultural resources. Where possible, DHS will work with Department of the Interior land managers, tribes and state historic preservation offices to protect these important sites.

Q: How are DHS and CBP committed to being "good stewards" of the land if they are waiving laws enacted to protect the environment and wildlife?

DHS will continue to protect natural and cultural resources as we have done in the past. And, we'll continue to partner with stakeholders and seek advice to mitigate possible environmental impacts of border security construction. Habitat and wildlife will continue to be protected.

Arizona's Barry M. Goldwater Range, the object of an earlier waiver, where DHS is funding mitigation and recovery efforts for the endangered Sonoran Pronghorn and lesser long-nosed bat, is just one example of how this is already being accomplished.

In the San Pedro National Riparian Conservation area in southern Arizona, also the object of an earlier waiver, DHS has made several changes to reduce the impact of fencing. In addition, DHS implementing a number of measures to reduce and monitor invasive plant species, erosion and sediment problems, and has dedicated more than \$1 million to the mitigation of two archeological sites in the conservation area.

Q: Is this waiver for a specific region or the entire country? What about the Hidalgo waiver?

The environmental waiver is for all border barrier projects planned for this year, which means it covers the geography associated with the individual segments from California to Texas. It does not represent one, contiguous (unbroken) line.

A separate waiver is being applied solely for the levee-border barrier project in Hidalgo County, Texas. This roughly 22-mile project will strengthen flood protection in the area while providing the Border Patrol with important tactical infrastructure. In addition to environmental and land management laws, this administrative waiver applies specifically to and only to the cooperative agreement with Hidalgo County Drainage District No. 1., and addresses other legal and administrative impediments to completing this project by the end of the calendar year.

Q: Could these waivers help implement "alternative" plans that DHS considered impossible to execute due to current laws or regulations?

No alternative plans proposed for strengthening border security have been rejected due to current environmental or contracting laws and regulations.

While CBP has consulted with other communities about a similar concept we have not yet received any detailed proposals or commitments on local funding or timelines. Any similar proposal could only be evaluated based on its ability to meet the complex operational, financial, environmental, and construction timeline requirements associated with the project.

Q: What will this mean for landowners who have been faced with condemnation?

The exercise of the waiver authority will not have a direct effect on the condemnation actions.

Q: What does it mean that Congress granted Secretary Chertoff waiver authority?

Recognizing the urgent need for additional border infrastructure, Congress granted the Secretary of Homeland Security the authority to waive certain laws to ensure expeditious construction of such infrastructure pursuant to Section 102 of the REAL ID Act of 2005.

The Secretary's use of the waiver authority will better ensure that DHS/CBP will meet its Congressional mandate by allowing construction to proceed without possible delays or interference from litigation and/or other administrative impediments.

Q: What will be gained by the Secretary exercising his waiver authority?

The Secretary's use of the waiver authority will better ensure that DHS/CBP will meet its Congressional mandate to secure the Southwest Border by allowing construction to proceed without possible delays or interference from litigation and/or other administrative impediments.

Q: What are the repercussions if DHS/CBP does not make the December 31 deadline?

The repercussions are that we will continue to have large stretches of our land borders that are vulnerable to exploitation by criminal and terrorist organizations. The American public has been loud and clear in their call for secure borders. Without the deployment of necessary fencing and technology, we place an unfair burden on our frontline personnel and will have difficulty meeting the expectations of the American public.

Border Patrol has determined that the stretches of the border covered under these waivers need some sort of barrier to prevent their continued use as corridors for illegal entry into the U.S.

To illustrate the importance and urgency of these border barrier projects:


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The sand dunes near the Buttercup Campground just outside of Yuma, AZ, is an area that has been **(b)** (7)(E) s one of the vehicle fencing projects covered under the Secretary's environmental waiver. On January 19, 2008, while attempting to stop two vehicles that had illegally entered the U.S. through this area, Senior Border Patrol Agent Luis Aguilar was struck and killed as both vehicles attempted (successfully) to evade apprehension and return to Mexico. **(b)** (7)(E) e longer we delay in the installation of vehicle barriers, the longer our Border Patrol agents will continue to be put in harm's way while trying to secure this area.

Brownsville has been and continues to be a focal point of illegal cross-border activity due to its proximity to Matamoros, (b) (7)(E)

(b) (7)(E) his area also has experienced a significant number of border violence incidents, including assaults on Border Patrol agents. Tactical infrastructure would greatly enhance this country's ability detect illegal incursions and deter illegal entry in that area.

El Calaboz- El Ranchito, Cameron County, Texas: The area south of the proposed fence is primarily farmland, dense brush and vegetation. Due to the proximity of the communities of El Calaboz and El Ranchito to the Rio Grande, (b) (7)(E)





Information Paper

Question. How will DHS continue to meet its requirement for consultation with local agencies and officials under the FY08 Appropriations Bill after the Waiver?

Answer. CBP has maintained a continuous effort to engage the public, regulatory agencies, stakeholders and local officials throughout the Secure Border Initiative programs. Coordination with Federal and State regulatory agencies and Native American Tribes has been an on-going process and will continue. CBP held 19 meetings with public groups in addition to town hall meetings. CBP held 50 separate meetings with a range of state and local officials.

For the pedestrian fence program, CBP held public scoping meetings in San Diego and Rio Grande Valley at the very beginning to obtain interest and comments from the public on the proposed actions to build tactical infrastructure. In addition, CBP had a public website (BorderfenceNEPA.com) where the draft NEPA documents were posted and comments from the public were solicited. CBP held 10 public open house meetings across the southwestern states to seek public comments on the draft Environmental Assessments and EIS's.

Each Border Patrol Sector continuously engages and informs the local community, stakeholders and local public officials on Border Patrol operational assessments to construct tactical infrastructure. There is an open and continuous exchange of information regarding how the tactical infrastructure will allow the Border Patrol to better patrol for and respond to illegal entries from illegal immigrants, possible terrorist threats, and the smuggling of illegal narcotics and contraband. In addition, each Sector coordinates its actions and seeks close partnerships and cooperation with stakeholders including local Tribes, as well as state and federal regulatory agencies.

For pedestrian fence as of March 28th, 2008, we are conducting or are scheduled to conduct survey and site exploration activities on all but 18 of the roughly 480 non-federal owners' properties; the remaining 18 are in the midst of negotiation and litigation toward securing a required Right of Entry. The results of those activities have enabled us to initiate negotiation with approximately 125 owners to purchase of portions of their property deemed necessary to support fence construction. However, despite extensive consultation, on certain Department of Interior lands where fence construction is planned, land managers have been unable to authorize all required survey and site exploration activities due to the laws this waiver addresses.

For the vehicle fence program, outreach and consultation with stakeholders will continue. CBP will continue to closely engage local communities regarding construction of tactical infrastructure. CBP will maintain the public website to post environmental studies for information and will hold public meetings associated with each project



For vehicle fence, which we intend to construct in California, Arizona and New Mexico, all known landowners have been approached and presented with a Right of Entry document for signature. Since the majority of the international boundary in these states is covered by the 60-foot Roosevelt Reservation, many of these owners control the abutting land that is required to access areas where fence will be constructed. It has been communicated to all owners that final determination of fence alignment and the access routes needed to support that construction are pending the survey and site exploration activities authorized in the Right of Entry. Thus far, fewer than two dozen private owners own land needed to support fence construction, and the majority has already signed Rights of Entry.

We are negotiating with Cocopah and Tohono O'odham Nations toward reaching resolutions authorizing access and construction activities, and the majority of private owners have signed Right of Entries. Discussions with the State of Arizona to gain access to their lands have commenced as have negotiations with the State of New Mexico to extend the duration of an existing blanket Right of Entry.

A considerable portion of the land where vehicle fence is planned is impacted by Department of the Interior ownership in that they control either the land upon which fence will be built and/or the access to that fence which predominantly resides within the sixty-foot Roosevelt Reservation. Despite extensive consultation, DOI land managers have been unable to authorize all required survey and site exploration activities due to the laws this waiver addresses.



Information Paper

Question: How Will DHS address the underlying environmental concerns and mitigate environmental impacts after the Waiver?

Answer: CBP has already largely completed the environmental analysis for the pedestrian fence program. This included development of 10 draft environmental planning documents (NEPA) and the associated studies and analysis to address natural and cultural resources. In these documents, in close coordination with the USFWS and State Historic Preservation Officers and tribes, CBP developed comprehensive mitigation plans to avoid, mitigate or compensate for potential impacts to natural and cultural resources.

Even though these documents were not finalized, CBP intends to implement these mitigation commitments. CBP had initiated the same process for the vehicle fence program and intends to continue this process to develop appropriate mitigations, in close coordination with the USFWS, SHPOs and tribes. These same mitigations will be implemented regardless of the owner of the land (private, DOI or non-DOI).

CBP, in close partnership with the USFWS, developed standard Best Management Practices (BMPs) for construction, operation and maintenance of tactical infrastructure. From the outset, CBP's objective has been to avoid impacts to endangered species to the maximum extent possible. For each project, CBP incorporates the appropriate BMPs for use to avoid or minimize potential impacts to endangered species. Many BMPs were taken from standard road construction best practices such as erosion control and invasive species control. In addition, specific BMPs were developed for each endangered species of concern along the southwestern border.

CBP is ensuring that the appropriate environmental BMP's are incorporated into each project's design and technical specifications. In addition, CBP will obtain an independent environmental compliance contractor (ECC) for each project apart from the construction contractor to monitor actions and ensure adherence with BMP's specified in the contract document's as well as conservation measures identified in the environmental planning documents. This assures independent monitoring of activities. CBP will conduct pre-construction surveys for migratory birds, endangered species and cultural resources. In addition, training on the identification of threatened and endangered species and measures to avoid harming these species will be provided for construction crews and all staff associated with each project.

CBP will continue its strong partnership with the USFWS. Through this consultation, USFWS advised CBP on options and approaches to modify certain projects (such as moving staging areas or access roads to avoid important habitat) to avoid or reduce potential impacts to threatened and



endangered species. In some cases, CBP was able to adjust BMPs, or actual fence location, or location of access roads and staging areas, based on USFWS advice, to reduce potential impacts.


To address unavoidable impacts to endangered species, CBP has committed to the USFWS to establish an Endangered Species Mitigation account, with an initial estimate of \$50 M, as part of a comprehensive Programmatic Mitigation/Compensation Agreement for the entire SBI Program. This agreement will ensure appropriate mitigations and compensations are funded.


Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will perform cultural resources surveys in all construction corridors prior to installing any tactical infrastructure along the southern border with Mexico to identify cultural sites. In the design of the tactical infrastructure, CBP will first try to avoid any impacts to cultural sites. CBP will perform appropriate testing and data recovery for any sites that can not be avoided.

To date about 90% of the southern border in Arizona and New Mexico has been surveyed. The remaining portions will be surveyed in the next few months. In addition, 80% of the California/Mexico border has been surveyed. These surveys have identified hundreds of cultural resources, including prehistoric and historic sites. When possible CBP avoids impacts to sites and leaves them preserved in place. However, in some cases sites cannot be avoided. In these instances CBP completes data recovery or archaeological excavation to mitigate damage to the sites. CBP has funded excavations at 39 sites in Arizona and New Mexico in just the past few years.

For example, two sites near Sasabe, Arizona were excavated in the spring and summer of 2007 in advance of the construction of pedestrian fence. One of these sites was a historic ranch occupied in the 19th century by a Tohono O'odham family who managed a cattle ranch and participated in legal, international cattle trade. Prior to the research funded by CBP little was know of this rancher or the international cattle trade of the 19th century. The second site was a prehistoric campsite occupied by a small family unit sometime around 500 A.D. This site offered limited data but contained stone tools made of stone from as far north as Phoenix, possibly indicating the family's migration route or trade relations.

In addition, CBP will complete studies and analysis of potential impacts to surface waters and wetlands associated with each construction project and mitigate appropriately for impacts to wetlands.





Proposed Environmental Stewardship and Outreach Plan for Pedestrian and Vehicle Fence Projects Along the Southwest Border Following the Secretary of DHS's Execution of Waiver Authority

Introduction

On April 1, 2008, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), pursuant to his authority under Section 102(c) of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA), as amended, 8 U.S.C. § 1103 note, exercised his authority to waive over 30 environmental laws and regulations associated with construction of tactical infrastructure (TI) along the southwestern border. These laws included the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Endangered Species Act, National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), the Clean Water Act (CWA), and others. Although the Secretary's waiver means that U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) no longer has any specific legal obligations under these 30 environmental laws and regulations, the Secretary is committed to proceeding in an environmentally sensitive manner and working closely with the appropriate resource agencies to minimize any adverse impacts to the environment, wildlife, and historic and cultural resources. CBP strongly supports this and remains committed to being a good steward of the environment and doing its best to honor the tenets of these environmental laws.

Environmental Tenets Under the Waiver

Enhance the security of the southwest border through the construction TI in a sensitive manner that allows for the conservation of natural and cultural resources Develop environmental planning documents which evaluate environmental resources present, analyze potential environmental impacts, and identify CBP mitigation commitments

Environmental planning documents will be designated as *Environmental Stewardship Plans (ESP)* and will include an analysis of resources similar to an Environmental Assessment (EA) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)

Continue to engage stakeholders and seek advice on identifying, minimizing, and mitigating environmental impacts

Use Best Management Practices (BMPs) and, in coordination with our resource agencies, implement appropriate mitigation measures

Provide an open and transparent process environmental planning process for public input and agency coordination

Environmental Efforts Completed Pre-Waiver

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)

DHS EXERCISES WAIVER AUTHORITY TO EXPEDITE ADVANCEMENTS IN BORDER SECURITY

WASHINGTON – The U.S. Department of Homeland Security announced today its intent to issue two waivers of certain laws to expedite security improvements at the southwest border. Congress gave the Secretary of Homeland Security authority to waive all legal requirements necessary to expeditiously install additional physical barriers and roads at the border to deter illegal activity.

"Criminal activity at the border does not stop for endless debate or protracted litigation," said Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff. "Congress and the American public have been adamant that they want and expect border security. We're serious about delivering it, and these waivers will enable important security projects to keep moving forward. At the same time, we value the need for public input on any potential impact of our border infrastructure plans on the environment—and we will continue to solicit it."

One waiver applies to certain environmental and land management laws for various project areas in Calif., Ariz., N.M., and Texas, encompassing roughly 470 total miles. It will facilitate additional pedestrian and vehicle fence construction, towers, sensors, cameras, detection equipment, and roads in the vicinity of the border.

A separate waiver was signed for the levee-border barrier project in Hidalgo County, Texas. This roughly 22-mile project will strengthen flood protection in the area while providing the Border Patrol with important tactical infrastructure. In addition to environmental and land management laws, this waiver addresses other legal and administrative impediments to completing this project by the end of the calendar year.

A substantial portion of the project areas addressed by these waivers have already undergone environmental reviews. In those areas where environmental reviews have not yet occurred, the department will conduct a review before any major construction begins. The department remains deeply committed to environmental responsibility, and will continue to work closely with the Department of Interior and other federal and state resources management agencies to ensure impacts to the environment, wildlife, and cultural and historic artifacts are analyzed and minimized.

The department also places a high priority on interaction with, and feedback from, local officials, landowners and community members about border infrastructure project plans. Since May 2007, more than 600 individual landowners have been contacted and over one hundred meetings with local officials, public open houses and town halls have been held along the southwest border.

The department has used its discretionary waiver authority on three previous occasions. Certain environmental restrictions were waived on Sept. 13, 2005 to complete a roughly 14-mile stretch of fencing, as part of the Border Infrastructure System, near San Diego, California. A second waiver of environmental restrictions was used for additional border infrastructure near the Barry M. Goldwater Range in southern Arizona. on Jan. 12, 2007. A third waiver of environmental restrictions was issued on Oct. 26, 2007, allowing the construction of border infrastructure to move forward near the San Pedro National Riparian Conservation Area in southern Arizona.

Department of the Interior Talking Points Concerning Real ID Act Waiver Invoked by Secretary Michael Chertoff **Department of Homeland Security** Thursday, March 27, 2008

Background

The Department of the Interior (DOI), through its constituent bureaus, administers a diversity of uniquely beautiful and environmentally sensitive lands along our Nation's Southwest border.

Over the past several years, the natural and cultural resources located on these lands have been adversely affected by illegal cross-border flow of people The safety of both visitors and employees of DOI lands have been significantly compromised by illegal immigration and drug trafficking. A National Park Service ranger, Kris Eggle, was murdered by a Mexican drug dealer in 2002. DOI supports the need for DHS to improve the security of our Nation along the border.

DOI believes that improved border infrastructure will enhance the safety of DOI visitors and employees and will help reverse the adverse environmental and cultural resources effects of illegal cross-border activities.

DOI has made it a top priority to work cooperatively with DHS in addressing the border security issues.

It is in DOI's best interests to assist DHS in constructing border security infrastructure in a manner that avoids or minimizes the effects of these facilities upon the natural and cultural resources of the area.

Cooperative Efforts to Date

Enhanced coordination at field and national levels, i.e. sector leaders and national borderland coordinator.

Improved process for resolving challenging and difficult issues with DHS.

Successful resolution of some issues, i.e.

Challenges Encountered

The construction of nearly 700 miles of border security infrastructure in a compressed time frame is a significant challenge for all involved, including DHS and DOI employees.

A project of this magnitude necessitates an array of moving parts and players that are often out of sync with one another, despite best intentions of all.

Effective communication and coordination within and between DHS and DOI have been and will continue to be very challenging.

DOI field managers have not always found it easy to communicate, negotiate, and work with DHS on these issues. Given DHS's extremely compressed time frame, their myriad of contractors, and the multitude of issues, it has been challenging for our field managers to represent the interests of their organizations.

In many cases, the infrastructure was modified to accommodate DOI field manager concerns. In other cases, DHS determined that border security needs were paramount, which prevented them from accepting DOI recommended modifications to the infrastructure.

Benefits of Working Collaboratively

DHS and DOI at the headquarters level have forged a strong relationship and an equal desire to work through border security and related natural and cultural resources issues in a collaborative fashion.

DHS accepts their environmental stewardship responsibility and their responsibility for avoiding damage to cultural resource sites.

Through productive discussions with DOI representative, DHS has committed to funding mitigation projects for threatened and endangered species valued up to \$50 million.

DHS has committed to repairing damage to cultural resource sites that previously occurred and to avoiding damage to other sites as construction continues.

The need for DHS and DOI to develop productive relationships at all levels will extend far beyond the construction phase of this project.

A New Paradigm - Environmental and Cultural Resource Issues after Waiver


Following the waivers, DHS and DOI will redefine their processes for addressing the construction of border security infrastructure in a manner that minimizes impacts to both natural and cultural resources.

DHS will continue to address environmental issues through the use of a newly developed "environmental planning documents" for each border patrol sector. Existing draft NEPA documents will be used for the development of these analyses.

To enhance coordination and communication, DHS and DOI will jointly develop "site design plans" for each component of the border security infrastructure that overlays DOI interests.

Among other important components, infrastructure location, design, and construction time table will be identified in the plan. In addition, all measures designed to avoid, minimize, or compensate for the adverse impacts of this infrastructure upon DOI lands and interests will be included in this plan.

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Talking Points Using the Secretary's Waiver Authority to Meet Border Barrier Requirements

- Operational Assessments by local Border Patrol Chiefs have identified locations along the southwest border where pedestrian or vehicle fencing is required to protect our borders.
- Based on these assessments and Congressional direction, CBP is committed to having a total of 370 miles of pedestrian fencing and 300 miles of vehicle fencing in place on the Southwest Border by the end of Calendar Year 2008.
- As of March 17, 2008, a total of 309 miles of fencing was in place along the southwest border –169 miles of pedestrian fencing and 140 miles of vehicle fencing.
- That means 361 miles of fencing (201 miles of pedestrian fencing and 160 miles of vehicle fencing) remain to be constructed within the next 9 months.
- Construction of the majority of these miles, which is necessary to meet a Congressional mandate of December 2008, are at considerable risk as a result of various legal and regulatory impediments and potential administrative delays. Expeditious construction of the remaining miles faces similar risks.
- After considering what we believe are all possible alternatives, the Secretary has decided to exercise his waiver authority to allow these as well as other important border barrier projects to proceed in a timely manner.
- He has issued two waivers
 - One that covers certain environmental and land management laws for projects where compliance with those laws or processes would prevent DHS from meeting its December 2008 mandate.
 - Another waiver is solely for the Hidalgo County, Texas levee-border barrier project. In addition to environmental and land management laws, this waiver addresses other laws that might be used to challenge and delay this mutually beneficial project.
- As has been the case in the past where the Secretary has waived certain environmental laws, he remains committed to proceeding in an environmentally sensitive manner and working closely with the appropriate resource agencies to minimize any adverse impacts to the environment, wildlife, and historic and cultural resources.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How much of the environmental assessment process has DHS completed?

The environmental review process includes extensive consultation with state and local officials, landowners, and the public. Federal agencies – such as the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the U.S. Forest Service, and the International Boundary and Water Commission – are also included in the review process.

DHS has initiated the environmental assessment process on all pedestrian fencing projects. In fact, a substantial portion of the project areas addressed by these waivers have already undergone environmental reviews. In those areas where environmental reviews have not yet occurred, the department will conduct a review before any major construction begins.

We have made significant progress in the development of NEPA documents for these projects and have released draft Environmental Impact Statements and Environmental Assessments for public comment and held public open house meetings. The environmental assessment process has been initiated or completed on over one third of the vehicle fencing projects.

Q: What happens to the Environmental Assessment/Environmental Impact Statements that have been prepared?

Although the Secretary has exercised the waiver authority, DHS remains committed to building this tactical infrastructure in an environmentally responsible manner. Our environmental planning documents will continue to guide the projects.

DHS will continue to coordinate with local natural resource managers, tribes and state historic preservation officers. We will continue to identify the natural, biological and cultural resources potentially impacted by each segment of the project, determine best management practices (BMPs) and devise appropriate mitigations and accommodation measures.

Environmental stewardship plans will be developed and implemented for each border infrastructure segment project.

Q: Will concerns outlined in these environmental publications (documents) be addressed?

Infrastructure location and design will be altered to minimize impacts wherever possible; where avoidance or minimization cannot be achieved, the Secretary is committed to executing reasonable mitigation measures for wildlife and habitat impacts.

In addition, the Secretary is committed to avoiding adverse impacts to historic and cultural resources. Where possible, DHS will work with Department of the Interior land managers, tribes and state historic preservation offices to protect these important sites.

Q: How are DHS and CBP committed to being "good stewards" of the land if they are waiving laws enacted to protect the environment and wildlife?

DHS will continue to protect natural and cultural resources as we have done in the past. And, we'll continue to partner with stakeholders and seek advice to mitigate possible environmental impacts of border security construction. Habitat and wildlife will continue to be protected.

Arizona's Barry M. Goldwater Range, the object of an earlier waiver, where DHS is funding mitigation and recovery efforts for the endangered Sonoran Pronghorn and lesser long-nosed bat, is just one example of how this is already being accomplished.

In the San Pedro National Riparian Conservation area in southern Arizona, also the object of an earlier waiver, DHS has made several changes to reduce the impact of fencing. In addition, DHS implementing a number of measures to reduce and monitor invasive plant species, erosion and sediment problems, and has dedicated more than \$1 million to the mitigation of two archeological sites in the conservation area.

Q: Is this waiver for a specific region or the entire country? What about the Hidalgo waiver?

The environmental waiver is for all border barrier projects planned for this year, which means it covers the geography associated with the individual segments from California to Texas. It does not represent one, contiguous (unbroken) line.

A separate waiver is being applied solely for the levee-border barrier project in Hidalgo County, Texas. This roughly 22-mile project will strengthen flood protection in the area while providing the Border Patrol with important tactical infrastructure. In addition to environmental and land management laws, this administrative waiver applies specifically to and only to the cooperative agreement with Hidalgo County Drainage District No. 1., and addresses other legal and administrative impediments to completing this project by the end of the calendar year.

Q: Could these waivers help implement "alternative" plans that DHS considered impossible to execute due to current laws or regulations?

No alternative plans proposed for strengthening border security have been rejected due to current environmental or contracting laws and regulations.

While CBP has consulted with other communities about a similar concept we have not yet received any detailed proposals or commitments on local funding or timelines. Any similar proposal could only be evaluated based on its ability to meet the complex operational, financial, environmental, and construction timeline requirements associated with the project.

Q: What will this mean for landowners who have been faced with condemnation?

The exercise of the waiver authority will not have a direct effect on the condemnation actions.

Q: What does it mean that Congress granted Secretary Chertoff waiver authority?

Recognizing the urgent need for additional border infrastructure, Congress granted the Secretary of Homeland Security the authority to waive certain laws to ensure expeditious construction of such infrastructure pursuant to Section 102 of the REAL ID Act of 2005.

The Secretary's use of the waiver authority will better ensure that DHS/CBP will meet its Congressional mandate by allowing construction to proceed without possible delays or interference from litigation and/or other administrative impediments.

Q: What will be gained by the Secretary exercising his waiver authority?

The Secretary's use of the waiver authority will better ensure that DHS/CBP will meet its Congressional mandate to secure the Southwest Border by allowing construction to proceed without possible delays or interference from litigation and/or other administrative impediments.

Q: What are the repercussions if DHS/CBP does not make the December 31 deadline?

The repercussions are that we will continue to have large stretches of our land borders that are vulnerable to exploitation by criminal and terrorist organizations. The American public has been loud and clear in their call for secure borders. Without the deployment of necessary fencing and technology, we place an unfair burden on our frontline personnel and will have difficulty meeting the expectations of the American public.

Border Patrol has determined that the stretches of the border covered under these waivers need some sort of barrier to prevent their continued use as corridors for illegal entry into the U.S.

To illustrate the importance and urgency of these border barrier projects:

- * The sand dunes near the Buttercup Campground just outside of Yuma, AZ, is an area that has been (b) (7)(E) s one of the vehicle fencing projects covered under the Secretary's environmental waiver. On January 19, 2008, while attempting to stop two vehicles that had illegally entered the U.S. through this area, Senior Border Patrol Agent Luis Aguilar was struck and killed as both vehicles attempted (successfully) to evade apprehension and return to Mexico. (b) (7)(E) longer we delay in the installation of vehicle barriers, the longer our Border Patrol agents will continue to be put in harm's way while trying to secure this area.
- Brownsville has been and continues to be a focal point of illegal cross-border activity due to its proximity to Matamoros, (b) (7)(E)
 bis area also has experienced a significant number of border violence incidents, including assaults on Border Patrol agents. Tactical infrastructure would greatly enhance this country's ability detect illegal incursions and deter illegal entry in that area.
- * El Calaboz- El Ranchito, Cameron County, TexThe area south of the proposed fence is primarily farmland, dense brush and vegetation. Due to the proximity of the communities of El Calaboz and El Ranchito to the Rio Grande, (b) (7)(E)



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
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Proposed Coordination Approach with Federal Land Managers for PF225/VF300 Under S1 Waiver



Proposed Environmental Stewardship for Pedestrian and Vehicle Fence Projects Along the Southwest Border Following the Secretary of DHS's Execution of Waiver Authority

Introduction

On April 1, 2008, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), pursuant to his authority under Section 102(c) of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act, as amended, 8 U.S.C. § 1103 note, exercised his authority to waive over 30 environmental laws and regulations associated with construction of tactical infrastructure (TI) along the southwestern border. These laws included the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Endangered Species Act, National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), the Clean Water Act (CWA), and others. Although the Secretary's waiver means that U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) no longer has any specific legal obligations under these 30 environmental laws and regulations, the Secretary is committed to proceeding in an environmentally sensitive manner and working closely with the appropriate resource agencies to minimize any adverse impacts to the environment, wildlife, and historic and cultural resources. CBP strongly supports this and remains committed to being a good steward of the environment and doing its best to honor the tenets of these environmental laws.

Environmental Tenets Under the Waiver

Enhance the security of the southwest border through the construction TI in a sensitive manner that allows for the conservation of natural and cultural resources Develop environmental planning documents which evaluate environmental resources present, analyze potential environmental impacts, and identify CBP mitigation commitments

Environmental planning documents will be designated as *Environmental Stewardship Plans (ESP)* and will include an analysis of resources similar to an Environmental Assessment (EA) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)

Continue to engage stakeholders and seek advice on identifying, minimizing, and mitigating environmental impacts

Use Best Management Practices (BMPs) and, in coordination with our resource agencies, implement appropriate mitigation measures

Provide an open and transparent process environmental planning process for public input and agency coordination

Environmental Efforts Completed Pre-Waiver

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)

Openly scoped projects in coordination with Federal and state agencies as well as the public to ensure potential environmental impacts were identified and thoroughly evaluated for each project

Conducted extensive consultations with resource agencies and local stakeholders which resulted in numerous changes to the TI alignment, location of access roads, and placement of staging areas in order to minimize potential environmental impacts Prepared and circulated for public comment and review 10 draft and 8 final NEPA documents (EAs/EISs)

• All Pedestrian Fence (PF) projects were analyzed in existing NEPA documents which were circulated for circulated for public review and comment in draft form

Threatened & Endangered (T&E) Species

Developed and maintained a strong partnership with the Department of Interior (DOI), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services (USFWS)

In partnership, USFWS and CBP expanded the Information, Planning and Consultation (IPaC) web-based planning tool to identify sensitive species and streamline the analysis for each project

In coordination with the USFWS, CBP developed a comprehensive list of construction Best Management Practices which will be incorporated into the TI construction contract documents

Currently, CBP and USFWS are developing a comprehensive programmatic mitigation agreement for unavoidable impacts to endangered species which result from the pedestrian and vehicle fence projects

Contributed to the scientific understanding of species recovery following wildfires by providing survey data for the San Diego project area

Cultural Resources

Maintained continuous, open consultation with State Historic Preservation Offices (SHPOs) and Native America Tribal Historic Offices regarding cultural resources and sensitive sites that could be affeted

Developed agreements with SHPO's and the Bureau of Land Management for additional study and data recovery of sites of cultural significance, for example the (b) (7) (E) urial site

Performed surveys of corridors, access roads, and staging areas to identify develop a comprehensive list sites of significance for the project Identified many sites which were previously unknown





Summary of Recommendations



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Talking Points Using the Secretary's Waiver Authority to Meet Border Barrier Requirements

- The AP article misrepresents the DOI letter dated Mar 3, 2008 to the Executive Director of the Secure Border Initiative.
- The AP letter quotes passages from the letter which by themselves would lead the reader to assume that CBP and USFWS were not working together and that USFWS was not informed of the "levee-wall design", this is false.
 - o Mr. Kenneth Stansell acknowledges in the letter that,

"... our staffs have been working together for the last 6 months..."

- USFWS letter also acknowledges that they knew of the fence/levee design for 4 weeks, "Approximately four weeks ago, the Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) was advised that CBP intended to pursue a project design that would combine the border fence project with a flood control project in (b) (7) (E) unty (segments (b) (7) (E) nd O^{(b)(7)(E)}
- As with all of the proposed fence segments, subsequent site visits and scoping meetings were held in September 2007 to review Border Patrol's original proposed alignment with various subject matter experts (real estate, environmental, construction) and regulators, including representatives from USFWS.
- In the RGV site meetings, USFWS had 3 representatives, a HQ representative, a local biologist, and a representative from DOI's Fish and Wildlife
 - During the week long site visit in RGV, USFWS stated concerns about fence alignment and impacts on endangered species.
 - Numerous modifications to the fence alignments were made to address these concerns. There were a few instances were CBP was unable to accommodate USFWS requests due to operational concerns.
- CBP and DOI have enjoyed a collaborative working relationship as a result of these site visits and subsequent meetings with DOI
- For several months Congressional representatives, with IBWC, DOI/FWS and CBP have be working in collaboration to solve our Nation's National Security Requirements, Protect our citizens from national disasters, while protecting our environment and wildlife resources,
- CBP engaged with (b) (7) (E) o staff on combining the County's Levee project and CBP Border Security fence project.
- This joint Wall/Levee project was shared with FWS in December of 07. CBP, DOI/FWS, IBWC and (b) (7) (E) o officials met several times to review the new wall/levee proposal to ensure the project was understood. The County officials shared with DOI the fact that most of the areas north of the proposed levee wall were slated for major development and a wall

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would keep wildlife and domestic animals separated which FWS agrees is a desirable option in the urbanized areas.

- DOI/FWS shared with CBP, based on the laws that govern National Wildlife Refuge Areas that CBP would have to use the tool (Waiver) that Congress gave the Secretary as the NRA doesn't allow a fence/walls or any other construction in a Refuge.
- CBP, IBWC and DOI/FWS staff met to develop an approach to overcome the challenges of the new proposal from (b) (7) (E) punty to combine the operational fence requirements with (b) (7) (E) requirement to repair and increase the levee's heights. In addition, DOI/FWS determined there were a couple of segments that the wall would be beneficial to the wildlife by keeping them away from shopping centers and domestic animals.
- DOI's closing paragraph indicated "We are very pleased with the outcome of the meeting.." and ..."confident that if we continue to work cooperatively towards these ends, both of our missions can be achieved."



Information Paper

Question. How will DHS continue to meet its requirement for consultation with local agencies and officials under the FY08 Appropriations Bill after the Waiver?

Answer. CBP has maintained a continuous effort to engage the public, regulatory agencies, stakeholders and local officials throughout the Secure Border Initiative programs. Coordination with Federal and State regulatory agencies and Native American Tribes has been an on-going process and will continue. CBP held 19 meetings with public groups in addition to town hall meetings. CBP held 50 separate meetings with a range of state and local officials.

For the pedestrian fence program, CBP held public scoping meetings in San Diego and Rio Grande Valley at the very beginning to obtain interest and comments from the public on the proposed actions to build tactical infrastructure. In addition, CBP had a public website (BorderfenceNEPA.com) where the draft NEPA documents were posted and comments from the public were solicited. CBP held 10 public open house meetings across the southwestern states to seek public comments on the draft Environmental Assessments and EIS's.

Each Border Patrol Sector continuously engages and informs the local community, stakeholders and local public officials on Border Patrol operational assessments to construct tactical infrastructure. There is an open and continuous exchange of information regarding how the tactical infrastructure will allow the Border Patrol to better patrol for and respond to illegal entries from illegal immigrants, possible terrorist threats, and the smuggling of illegal narcotics and contraband. In addition, each Sector coordinates its actions and seeks close partnerships and cooperation with stakeholders including local Tribes, as well as state and federal regulatory agencies.

For pedestrian fence as of March 28th, 2008, we are conducting or are scheduled to conduct survey and site exploration activities on all but 18 of the roughly 480 non-federal owners' properties; the remaining 18 are in the midst of negotiation and litigation toward securing a required Right of Entry. The results of those activities have enabled us to initiate negotiation with approximately 125 owners to purchase of portions of their property deemed necessary to support fence construction. However, despite extensive consultation, on certain Department of Interior lands where fence construction is planned, land managers have been unable to authorize all required survey and site exploration activities due to the laws this waiver addresses.

For the vehicle fence program, outreach and consultation with stakeholders will continue. CBP will continue to closely engage local communities regarding construction of tactical infrastructure. CBP will maintain the public website to post environmental studies for information and will hold public meetings associated with each project



For vehicle fence, which we intend to construct in California, Arizona and New Mexico, all known landowners have been approached and presented with a Right of Entry document for signature. Since the majority of the international boundary in these states is covered by the 60-foot Roosevelt Reservation, many of these owners control the abutting land that is required to access areas where fence will be constructed. It has been communicated to all owners that final determination of fence alignment and the access routes needed to support that construction are pending the survey and site exploration activities authorized in the Right of Entry. Thus far, fewer than two dozen private owners own land needed to support fence construction, and the majority has already signed Rights of Entry.

We are negotiating with Cocopah and Tohono O'odham Nations toward reaching resolutions authorizing access and construction activities, and the majority of private owners have signed Right of Entries. Discussions with the State of Arizona to gain access to their lands have commenced as have negotiations with the State of New Mexico to extend the duration of an existing blanket Right of Entry.

A considerable portion of the land where vehicle fence is planned is impacted by Department of the Interior ownership in that they control either the land upon which fence will be built and/or the access to that fence which predominantly resides within the sixty-foot Roosevelt Reservation. Despite extensive consultation, DOI land managers have been unable to authorize all required survey and site exploration activities due to the laws this waiver addresses.



Information Paper

Question: How Will DHS address the underlying environmental concerns and mitigate environmental impacts after the Waiver?

Answer: CBP has already largely completed the environmental analysis for the pedestrian fence program. This included development of 10 draft environmental planning documents (NEPA) and the associated studies and analysis to address natural and cultural resources. In these documents, in close coordination with the USFWS and State Historic Preservation Officers and tribes, CBP developed comprehensive mitigation plans to avoid, mitigate or compensate for potential impacts to natural and cultural resources.

Even though these documents were not finalized, CBP intends to implement these mitigation commitments. CBP had initiated the same process for the vehicle fence program and intends to continue this process to develop appropriate mitigations, in close coordination with the USFWS, SHPOs and tribes. These same mitigations will be implemented regardless of the owner of the land (private, DOI or non-DOI).

CBP, in close partnership with the USFWS, developed standard Best Management Practices (BMPs) for construction, operation and maintenance of tactical infrastructure. From the outset, CBP's objective has been to avoid impacts to endangered species to the maximum extent possible. For each project, CBP incorporates the appropriate BMPs for use to avoid or minimize potential impacts to endangered species. Many BMPs were taken from standard road construction best practices such as erosion control and invasive species control. In addition, specific BMPs were developed for each endangered species of concern along the southwestern border.

CBP is ensuring that the appropriate environmental BMP's are incorporated into each project's design and technical specifications. In addition, CBP will obtain an independent environmental compliance contractor (ECC) for each project apart from the construction contractor to monitor actions and ensure adherence with BMP's specified in the contract document's as well as conservation measures identified in the environmental planning documents. This assures independent monitoring of activities. CBP will conduct pre-construction surveys for migratory birds, endangered species and cultural resources. In addition, training on the identification of threatened and endangered species and measures to avoid harming these species will be provided for construction crews and all staff associated with each project.

CBP will continue its strong partnership with the USFWS. Through this consultation, USFWS advised CBP on options and approaches to modify certain projects (such as moving staging areas or access roads to avoid important habitat) to avoid or reduce potential impacts to threatened and



endangered species. In some cases, CBP was able to adjust BMPs, or actual fence location, or location of access roads and staging areas, based on USFWS advice, to reduce potential impacts.

To address unavoidable impacts to endangered species, CBP has committed to the USFWS to establish an Endangered Species Mitigation account, with an initial estimate of \$50 M, as part of a comprehensive Programmatic Mitigation/Compensation Agreement for the entire SBI Program. This agreement will ensure appropriate mitigations and compensations are funded.

Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will perform cultural resources surveys in all construction corridors prior to installing any tactical infrastructure along the southern border with Mexico to identify cultural sites. In the design of the tactical infrastructure, CBP will first try to avoid any impacts to cultural sites. CBP will perform appropriate testing and data recovery for any sites that can not be avoided.

To date about 90% of the southern border in Arizona and New Mexico has been surveyed. The remaining portions will be surveyed in the next few months. In addition, 80% of the California/Mexico border has been surveyed. These surveys have identified hundreds of cultural resources, including prehistoric and historic sites. When possible CBP avoids impacts to sites and leaves them preserved in place. However, in some cases sites cannot be avoided. In these instances CBP completes data recovery or archaeological excavation to mitigate damage to the sites. CBP has funded excavations at 39 sites in Arizona and New Mexico in just the past few years.

For example, two sites near Sasabe, Arizona were excavated in the spring and summer of 2007 in advance of the construction of pedestrian fence. One of these sites was a historic ranch occupied in the 19th century by a Tohono O'odham family who managed a cattle ranch and participated in legal, international cattle trade. Prior to the research funded by CBP little was know of this rancher or the international cattle trade of the 19th century. The second site was a prehistoric campsite occupied by a small family unit sometime around 500 A.D. This site offered limited data but contained stone tools made of stone from as far north as Phoenix, possibly indicating the family's migration route or trade relations.


In addition, CBP will complete studies and analysis of potential impacts to surface waters and wetlands associated with each construction project and mitigate appropriately for impacts to wetlands.


Talking Points Using the Secretary's Waiver Authority to Meet Border Barrier Requirements

- Operational Assessments by local Border Patrol Chiefs have identified locations along the southwest border where pedestrian or vehicle fencing is required to protect our borders. In total, the assessments call for 370 miles of pedestrian fencing and 300 miles of vehicle fencing.
- Recognizing the importance and urgency of securing our borders, Congress, with the President's concurrence, mandated that construction of this required fencing be completed by the end of Calendar Year 2008.
- As of March 17, 2008, a total of 309 miles of fencing is in place along the southwest border 169 miles of pedestrian fencing and 140 miles of vehicle fencing.
- 361 miles of fencing (201 pedestrian fencing and 160 vehicle fencing) remain to be constructed within the next 9 months.
- Of these 361 remaining miles, 55 miles are under construction, under contract, or deemed as military (OJS and JTFN) projects, leaving 306 miles.
- Of those 306 miles
 - 234 miles are at risk due to DOI's determination they cannot provide relief from Endangered Species Act (ESA), Wilderness Act, Refuge Act, statutorily mandated timelines with their entry and construction permitting process.
 - Our ability to construc (b) (7)(E) in coordination with levee improvements i (b) (7)(E) County is at risk because o la k of legislative authority for CBP and the County to enter into a cooperative agreement.

Work on a joint levee-border barrier project would meet both CBP's border security requirements and (b) (7)(E) unty's flood protection requirements.


- After considering what we believe are all possible alternatives, the Secretary has decided to exercise his waiver authority to allow these as well as other important border barrier projects to proceed in a timely manner.
- He has issued two waivers
 - One that covers environmental laws and permitting processes for projects where compliance with those laws or processes would prevent DHS from meeting its December 2008 mandate.
 - Another waiver is solely for (b) (7)(E) levee-border barrier project. In additional to environmental laws, this waiver addresses other legal impediments to CBP and (b) (7)(E) County entering into this mutually-beneficial project together.
- As has been the case in the past where the Secretary has waived certain environmental laws, he remains committed to proceeding in an environmentally sensitive manner and working closely with the Department of Interior and other federal and state agencies to minimize any adverse impacts to the environment, wildlife, or historic and cultural resources.

Proposed Environmental Stewardship and Outreach Plan for Pedestrian and Vehicle Fence Projects Along the Southwest Border Following the Secretary of DHS's Execution of Waiver Authority

Introduction

On April 1, 2008, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), pursuant to his authority under Section 102(c) of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA), as amended, 8 U.S.C. § 1103 note, exercised his authority to waive over 30 environmental laws and regulations associated with construction of tactical infrastructure (TI) along the southwestern border. These laws included the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Endangered Species Act, National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), the Clean Water Act (CWA), and others. Although the Secretary's waiver means that U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) no longer has any specific legal obligations under these 30 environmental laws and regulations, the Secretary is committed to proceeding in an environmentally sensitive manner and working closely with the appropriate resource agencies to minimize any adverse impacts to the environment, wildlife, and historic and cultural resources. CBP strongly supports this and remains committed to being a good steward of the environment and doing its best to honor the tenets of these environmental laws.



The US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Engineering and Construction Support Office (ECSO) assist the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Customs and Border Protection (CBP) in their endeavors to plan and construct tactical infrastructure improvement projects to support their mission of protecting the United States' (US) border. With the passage of the Secure Fence Act of 2006 (SFA), Congress authorized the construction of a border fence and associated tactical infrastructure. This program includes physical implementation of tactical infrastructure, such as fencing and associated infrastructure.


In accordance with the S-1 Wavier, the proposed fence construction projects are not required to comply with the Federal environmental laws, regulations and executive orders. These laws, regulations and executive orders include, but are not limited to:

- * National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA),
- * Clean Water Act (CWA),
- * Endangered Species Act (ESA),
- * National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), and
- * Executive Orders 11988 (Floodplain Management) and 11990 (Protection of Wetlands).


Because of the uniqueness of this program and it's relatively short duration coupled with the large number of potential and planned projects and the number of technical documents required to be prepared, specialized assistance will be needed by ECSO in managing and monitoring the Environmental Planning Documents (EPD) efforts.

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Background



- Secretary Chertoff has committed that DHS will build a total of 370 miles of pedestrian fence along the Southwest border by the end of CY 2008.
 - By the end of FY 2007, CBP had more than 145 miles of pedestrian fencing completed along the Southwest border.
 - By the end of CY 2008, an additional 225 miles will be built, for a total of 370 miles.
- Fencing is but one element of DHS's layered defense plan to gain effective control of our Nation's borders. Our comprehensive plan includes additional, substantial investments in technology, infrastructure, and enforcement personnel.
- Fencing and technology are complementary tools. Technology allows the Border Patrol to identify and track illegal activity. Fencing gives Border Patrol agents time they need to respond to illegal cross border activity. A combination of technology and tactical infrastructure best allows Border Patrol to do their job safely and effectively.
- Fencing also acts as a deterrent and barrier from violent crimes and smuggling across our southwest border. By reducing our vulnerability to illegal crossings, we are able to reduce our risk to environmental damage by trespassers and criminal activity coming across our border.
- DHS will deploy the right mix of technology, tactical infrastructure, and personnel to secure each mile of the border as quickly and efficiently as possible.



Fence Status



- Operational Assessments by local Border Patrol Chiefs have identified locations along the southwest border where pedestrian or vehicle fencing is required to protect our borders. In total, the assessments call for 370 miles of pedestrian fencing and 300 miles of vehicle fencing.
- Recognizing the importance and urgency of securing our borders, Congress mandated that construction of 370 miles of pedestrian fencing be completed by the end of Calendar Year 2008.
- As of March 17, 2008, a total of 309 miles of fencing is in place along the southwest border 169 miles of pedestrian fencing and 140 miles of vehicle fencing.
- 361 miles of fencing (201 pedestrian fencing and 160 vehicle fencing) remain to be constructed within the next 9 months.
- Of these 361 remaining miles, 48 miles are under construction or out for bid, leaving 313 miles.
- Of those 306 miles
 - Approximately 234 of those miles to be constructed on federal lands were determined by DHS to be at risk due to legal and administrative impediments, e.g., DOI cannot authorize construction in Wilderness Areas or National Wildlife Refuges, obtaining the necessary rights of way for other federal lands is a lengthy process and the timely completion of Biological Opinions.
 - The remaining miles, which are to be constructed on non-federal lands, also face potential legal and administrative impediments that will delay construction, e.g., NEPA or other environmental litigation.
 - Our ability to construct approximately (b) (7)(E) in coordination with levee improvements in (b) (7)(E)
 County is at risk because of lack of legislative authority for CBP and the County to enter into a arrangement.

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
Exercising Waiver Authority



- Congress has recognized that securing the Nation's borders has a significant impact on our national security and has provided legal authority for the Secretary to waive any restrictions that may impede progress toward deterring illegal entry.
- After considering what we believe are all possible alternatives, the Secretary has decided to exercise
 his waiver authority to allow these as well as other important border barrier projects to proceed in a
 timely manner.
- · The Secretary issued two waivers:
 - One that covers environmental laws and permitting processes for projects where compliance with those laws or processes would prevent DHS from meeting its December 2008 mandate.
 - Waiver covers all PF225 and VF300 segments (including contingency miles)
 - Does not include the following VF segments
 (b) (7) (E) and (b) (7) (E)
 - A total of approximately 470 miles of border covered by the waiver
 - Another waiver was solely for the (b) (7)(E) levee-border barrier project. In additional to environmental laws, this waiver addresses other legal impediments to CBP and (b) (7)(E) County entering into this mutually-beneficial project together.
- As has been the case in the past where the Secretary has waived certain environmental laws, he
 remains committed to proceeding in an environmentally sensitive manner and working closely with the
 Department of Interior and other resource agencies to minimize any adverse impacts to the
 environment, wildlife, or historic and cultural resources.


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


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

- 1. **Purpose**. To provide a summary and basis of the environmental costs documented in the El Paso PF225 ESP
- 2. Background and Discussion.
 - a.  - b. The attached table (Table 2), taken from the El Paso ESP, summarizes the environmental impacts associated with construction of the fence and the Best Management Practices (BMPs) and mitigations planned to offset those impacts.
 - c. Most of the costs for BMPs associated with the construction, such as erosion control and preparation and implementation of numerous plans including the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP), Construction Mitigation and Restoration Plan (CMRP), Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures Plan (SPCCP) and Unanticipated Discovery Plan are standard procedures in all fence construction contracts. Although these are intended to protect the environment, they are an integral part of standard construction procedures and we did not isolate these costs.
 - d. Environmental mitigation costs were identified as those actions recommended/ planned above standard construction practices. These costs were grouped into four "baskets": endangered species, cultural resources, surface waters and wetlands, and certain added BMPs for the project. The added BMPs include costs for biological and cultural resources monitors.
 - e. Over the course of developing the ESP, CBP and USACE personnel held several meetings with stakeholders (state and federal resource agencies and local ranchers and Water District) to discuss fence options and potential mitigations. Monitoring for the presence of burrowing owls in the sides of the levee will be conducted, and relocation of owls present will be accomplished outside of the nesting season, to the

extent practicable. Monitoring of open post holes and trenches will take place daily to reduce or avoid impacts on Texas horned lizards and other small animals. In addition, small animal pass-through gaps will be included in the bottom of the fence to facilitate migration between the floodplain and lands to the north of the levee. Light switches will be installed, as specified in a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the **(b)** (7) (E) so that lights can be turned off when necessary during tribal ceremonies along the river. Access to the river will be provided with gates in the fence at prescribed locations.

- f. Total mitigations for El Paso were estimated at \$ (b) (5) as follows:
 - Endangered Species Mitigations. There are no Endangered Species in these segments. However, efforts were taken to help mitigate any northsouth movement by small animals including the Texas horned lizard by including gaps in the fence.
 - 2) Cultural Resources Mitigations. There are no additional cultural mitigation costs (e.g. testing or data recovery) required for El Paso. However, there are required costs for cultural resource monitoring during excavation activities in case any resources are unearthed during construction.
 - 3) **Surface Waters and Wetlands Mitigations**. Since all the construction is along the levee, there are no wetlands mitigations required.
 - 4) Added BMPs. An estimated \$ (b) (5) is required for monitoring and costs associated with construction crew training, migratory bird surveys, cleaning of construction equipment moving between segments to minimize risk of transporting invasive species, and actual monitoring during construction. Monitoring costs assumed an on-site monitor for each fence section and construction rate of 0.1mi/day and for preparation of post-construction environmental reports to address what, and how effective, CBP's avoidance and minimization actions were during the construction phase of the projects.



We had actually garnered some support within CBP for a year or so to fund a comprehensive border ecosystem health program, but with all the delays in negotiating things with all the groups, CBP leadership finally got turned off on that—as the political mood from the Hill also changed to not spend




