Depending on the office, leadership determines if the support requested is feasible and if resources are available to support Federal, State, or Local Law Enforcement. All support requests require approval from the Chief of Law Enforcement Operations and the Deputy Chief or their designee. Furthermore, depending on the significance of an event, a request for mutual aid or a law enforcement response may not go through a typical chain of commander approval process. Accordingly, depending on the level of engagement, requests may not be tracked. Requests for equipment are not tracked in an official system of record. Instead, the requests are generally received in person, telephonic, or via e-mail.

b. Who at your agencies is responsible for approving such requests?

Each operational office has its own approval process for requests. For instance, in the U.S. Border Patrol (USBP) Sector Chiefs, Chief of Operations, and the Deputy Chief, or designee, at Headquarters approve support requests. As for Office of Field Operations (OFO) — any requests for assistance are received through the local Field Office or Port of Entry and subsequently, provided to OFO Operational Executive Director for situational awareness.

c. Have your agencies deployed personnel or equipment to any jurisdictions that did not request assistance?

The locations of these deployments have been in the following states: Illinois, New York, Ohio, Texas, Michigan, California, Florida, Minnesota, Pennsylvania and Washington, DC. The total duration from May 29, 2020 – July 10, 2020 is 326.4 total operational hours. The nature of these deployments were based on the requests. 6 USC § 211(f)(3)(C), authorizes the agency to conduct aviation and marine operations in support of federal, state, local, tribal, and international law enforcement agencies. These authorities are also provided pursuant to the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2020, P.L. 116-93, Div. D, Title II.

- c. What, if any, surveillance capabilities were utilized?**

CBP's aircrafts can be equipped with cameras, radar, and/or other technologies to support CBP components in patrolling the border, conducting surveillance as part of a law enforcement investigation or tactical operation, and responding to other significant incidents as directed.

d. Whether any footage obtained by the aviation assets are being shared with local, state, or federal agencies for law enforcement purposes.

Footage from AMO aircraft systems is not shared with other law enforcement agencies, unless needed for an investigation or in connection with a law enforcement activity. Requests for footage must be processed, reviewed, and approved before dissemination by the CBP Office of Intelligence's Production, Exploitation, and Dissemination Cell.

5. What uniforms, identification, and equipment will personnel participating in these deployments wear and carry? Please provide any relevant policies and procedures with your response.

While uniform policies slightly differ between CBP components, common requirements are found in each component uniform policies. The policies require the use of identifiable agency uniforms with badging and name tapes on the outermost garment (e.g. jacket, body armor). Additionally, the CBP Use of Force Policy, Guidelines and Procedures Handbook govern the carriage of specified equipment, while in uniform. These equipment carriage requirements are as follows:

(b)(7)(E)

6. ICE has stated that it “fully respects the rights of all people to peacefully express their opinions” and CBP has stated that it “support[s] those who participate in lawful protests.” How have you defined these standards, and what training have your personnel received regarding the standards that they are required to apply?

CBP officers and agents receive training regarding Constitutional Law at the CBP Basic Academies. Additionally, the CBP Use of Force Policy, Guidelines and Procedures Handbook, HB 4500-01C clearly states that CBP’s actions are governed by a respect for human life and the communities that the agency serves shall guide all employees in the performance of their duties. This principle includes the respect and support of the Constitutional rights of our people within the United States. CBP law enforcement personnel receive CBP Use of Policy training during quarterly training throughout each year.

In support and reinforcement of the training received at the basic academy and reiterated with the Use of Force Policy, CBP Office of Chief Council provides Civil Response Instruction to responders, designed to emphasize the First Amendment rights of the people and the responsibilities of CBP.

a. Have your personnel received training regarding applicable privacy laws?

Constitutional Law is taught at the CBP Basic Academies. All Agents/Officers receive instruction on Fourth and Fifth Amendments and the rights they bestow. The CBP Less-Lethal Instructor Training program (LLITP) is an extension of training that occurs at the CBP Basic Academies, and certifies officers/agents as instructors to conduct on-going, in-service Use of Force training to field personnel. Although students attending the LLITP have already received a foundational understanding of Constitutional Law prior to their attendance in the LESC’s training programs, LESC enhances that understanding through direct collaboration with Office of Chief Counsel to include an additional, more in depth presentation/discussion of Constitutional rights, focusing specifically on the Fourth amendment.

Additionally, CBP uniformed personnel who are asked to provide assistance are provided additional Civil Unrest Response training on the First Amendment rights of protestors, legal authorities, and the Fourth Amendment, including the legally permissible use of force.

b. Have your personnel received training on the appropriate use of force, including methods of de-escalation?

All CBP officers and agents have received training at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) and are trained to assist other law enforcement entities in this situation. CBP personnel have received advanced training for operations in chaotic environments such as the ones we currently face across the country. Additionally, as per the CBP Use of Force Policy, Guidelines and Procedures Handbook, all CBP law

enforcement personnel continue their use of force training, during designated training periods every year. All CBP use of force training is administered by CBP certified use of force instructors. CBP certified use of force instructors receive training on de-escalation tactics and techniques, and the teaching of said techniques, in stand-alone blocks of instruction during their instructor certification courses. De-escalation techniques and tactics are also instructed with device-specific blocks of instruction. CBP's de-escalation techniques and tactics include: performing threat assessments, identifying behaviors of people experiencing various stages of crisis, and the use of safe tactics to attempt to bring all law enforcement encounters to safest possible law enforcement conclusion for all parties involved.

c. Have your personnel received training regarding the exercise of First Amendment rights, including the freedom of speech and the freedom of assembly?

CBP law enforcement personnel deployed to civil unrest situation are provided legal instruction, which augments CBP's recurring use of force training and reiterates Constitutional Law. This legal briefing, like the CBP's use of force policy, is based off the United States Constitution as well as seminal United States Supreme Court cases. The guidance/analysis in this briefing and the CBP use of force policy, make it clear that non-violent, non-aggressive gatherings of people invoking their First Amendment rights.

CBP uniformed personnel who are asked to provide assistance are also provided additional Civil Unrest Response training on the First Amendment rights of protestors, legal authorities, and the Fourth Amendment, including the legally permissible use of force.

7. What forms of force are your personnel authorized to utilize as part of these deployments?

The CBP Use of Force Policy, Guidelines and Procedures Handbook, the United States Constitution, and seminal United States Supreme Court cases concerning uses of force regardless of mission govern all uses of force by CBP law enforcement personnel. This policy clearly states that authorized Officers/Agents may use objectively reasonable force only when it is necessary to carry out their law enforcement duties.

8. Please provide any guidance that you distributed to your personnel reflecting your public statements that your agencies are not conducting immigration-related activities, including a detailed description of any training received by personnel, relating to questions (a) and (b) below.

a. Please confirm that both of your agencies will not conduct immigration enforcement activities, including referrals for immigration enforcement, at protests and demonstrations.

This deployment is about supporting the efforts of our federal, state and local partners, not about carrying out CBP's immigration enforcement mission. This response is about the preservation of life and safety. Beyond that, CBP has not made any additional comments/statements to this effort. CBP officers/agents have the authority to arrest for any federal crime committed in the officer/agent's presence or for federal felonies if the officer/agent has reasonable grounds to believe that the person has committed such felony. In some locations, CBP's authority has been augmented by Federal Protective Service (FPS) designation to convey authorities and training specific to protection of federal property. In addition, while providing support to the National Capital Region, the U.S. Marshals Service (USMS) granted special deputy status to federal officers and agents to further USMS federal law enforcement functions.

Dear Acting Commissioner Morgan and Acting Director Albence:

We are writing to you today regarding recent reports that U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) are deploying resources in connection with demonstrations nationwide. As both CBP and ICE have acknowledged, the right to peaceful protest is a bedrock principle of our democracy. We write to you today to request information regarding ICE and CBP operations in connection with demonstrations, particularly in light of public reports that law enforcement have used force—including tear gas, spray chemical irritants, non-lethal bullets, and other forms of force.

It is critical to understand how ICE and CBP are using their resources, particularly during the ongoing public health crisis that has sickened over 1.8 million people in the United States and claimed over 100,000 American lives. On May 31, CBP informed Congress that CBP “is currently deploying officers, agents and aviation assets across the country at the request of our federal, state and local partners.”¹ The notification referenced routine CBP operations “to augment law enforcement and humanitarian relief efforts.” On June 1, ICE issued a statement indicating that “ICE personnel and Special Response Teams have been deployed . . .” for similar purposes.² Your agencies’ public statements and responses to congressional staff to date have provided extremely limited details regarding the nature and purpose of these deployments.

It is also vital to ensure that ICE and CBP are acting responsibly, reasonably, and within their respective authorities. CBP has stated that “CBP’s deployment of manpower and aerial assets is about supporting the efforts of our federal, state and local partners, not about carrying out CBP’s immigration enforcement mission.”³ An ICE spokesperson similarly stated that “[t]here’s not going to be any immigration enforcement element whatsoever.”⁴ We need answers regarding what, precisely, your agencies will be doing and what policies and procedures are in place to protect the rights of individuals with whom you come into contact.

We therefore ask that you respond to the following questions by June 12, 2020:

1. How do your agencies track requests for assistance or resources, including both requests for personnel and equipment?
 - a. What is the approval process for such requests?

AMO aircraft can be equipped with cameras, radar, and/or other technologies to support CBP components in patrolling the border, conducting surveillance as part of a law enforcement investigation or tactical operation, and responding to other significant incidents as directed.

d. Whether any footage obtained by the aviation assets are being shared with local, state, or federal agencies for law enforcement purposes

Footage from AMO aircraft systems is not typically shared with other law enforcement agencies, unless needed for an investigation or in connection with a law enforcement activity. Requests for footage must be processed, reviewed, and approved before dissemination by the CBP Office of Intelligence's Production, Exploitation, and Dissemination Cell.

Admiral Tomney,

The USSS has updated the request from (b)(7)(E) towards the Chicago effort. The USSS still emphasizes that the USSS, at this time, is expecting a "potential" POTUS trip on Wednesday, July 22, 2020, and the (b)(7)(E) will be available immediately following the visit. The 1811 personnel to support the DOJ Federal effort, as previously outlined, may be best aligned to provide support with the Cyber Fraud Taskforces (CFTF), Mobile Wireless Investigation (MWI), Investigative Analysis, Open Source Analysis and participation on the JTTF.

The current campaign activities in the Chicago district will be extremely challenging without the flexibility of the (b)(7)(E) at times, when spontaneous visits occur of USSS protectees. Additionally, the USSS has briefed the DNC in Milwaukee, WI and scheduled for August 17-20, 2020. Resources will start arriving for the NSSE approximately on August 3, 2020, and the USSS will again ask for flexibility with the (b)(7)(E) assigned to support the DOJ effort.

Recommendation: Until we get clear direction from the FBI or the US Attorney in Chicago, DHS prepares 1811s for TDY deployment to Chicago but hold tight until we get the green light from either the FBI or US Atty on when we are needed and who to report to for case support. Let components surge

additional agents to their Chicago field offices to bolster component-level investigations – if components should desire to do so on their own – while the US Atty and FBI sort out the federal strategy.

Thus, please continue to plan for a deployment to Chicago but do not launch any additional 1811s until the Department gets additional guidance from DOJ/FBI/US Atty. Components are free to send additional resources to your own offices as you normally would if you have an internal need.

I will keep you posted as I hear more. AS1 is having a phone call later today with the AG to discuss Chicago.

Mission: In conversations with the US Attorney for Chicago (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and FBI Dep Dir (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), the mission is still being worked out. Goal is to reduce violence in the city. US Atty is open to either having agencies plus up their own staffs to work their own investigations faster/quicker or more investigations "if" they will assist in reducing violence. The other school of thought is to have agencies jump on joint task/strike forces targeting guns, gangs etc. No clear model is merging and it may be a combination of both models.

Authorities: There's been no request for federal assistance from either State or local city officials. Thus, federal agents will use federal authorities and work on federal cases. At the request of the AG's office, the AG would like to offer US Marshals Service deputation to all of our officers that will support this effort. Such a deputation will provide additional federal authorities for all of our LEOs supporting this effort. OGC is coordinating this effort between the USMS and component POCs; DHS POCs were sent to USMS. Plan is for the paperwork to be completed prior to our LEOs arriving in Chicago and then get deputized upon arrival in the city.

Funding: Funding is a concern for all our agencies, particularly this late in the FY, and acutely so for our fee-for-service FPS. Given the anticipated role for DHS LEOs (either working on agency investigations or as part of a joint task force), every agency is expected to pay their own way. There appears to be no plans for DOJ reimbursement to DHS.

Potential Expansion: While all eyes are on Chicago, there are plans to possibly expand this model to other cities in the coming weeks. Two potential cities mentioned this week include Kansas City and Albuquerque.

Finally, I've listed on the Cc line those leaders within the components and staffs who have participated in numerous short noticed OPSDEPS/PACT calls to plan and source numerous requests for personnel – not only for Chicago but also before/during/after the 4th of July weekend in numerous cities around the country. The Cc line are the component and staff leaders who are being innovative and forward leaning to ensure maximum support to our interagency partners and one another. None of the past or planned deployments would have been possible without their leadership.

Attached / below is the requisite report surrounding our involvement in support of FPS to protect the federal buildings downtown yesterday. Overall, the EPFO provided a total of (b)(7)(E) CBPOs and (b)(7)(E) SRT Operators to support FPS, who only had (b)(7)(E) Officers to protect the federal buildings downtown. While they were augmented by STLs, the STLs assistance (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E) Overall, the protest was peaceful with a few agitators that were eventually removed by the El Paso Police Department. Of note are two calls received by the Office of the Congresswoman and the Congresswoman herself. Director Byrd (Office of Congresswoman) contacted me via cell phone late last night to inquire as to the need to have so many Officers in "riot gear" to address a small group of "peaceful protestors". I informed Director Byrd that we were in support of FPS that had a limited number of Officers to secure federal buildings. She was provided the general number of personnel we had deployed and she stated she understood. Shortly after my call, Congresswoman Escobar called the DFO to express her dismay and displeasure with CBP providing any support to our federal/state partners, to include the other, more aggressive protest that was held Saturday evening at police headquarters (BPAs were only present for that one and not CBPOs). The DFO provided the similar response to the Congresswoman that I did to Director Byrd, however, the Congresswoman stated she planned to call the Commissioner today. She stated she planned to express her complete displeasure with CBP providing any assistance to federal/state partners, not just within our AOR, but nationwide. She further stated she has taken significant issue with the Commissioner's recent tweets regarding this support and the overall position of the administration on handling these "peaceful protests". The DFO and I wanted to ensure awareness in the event the Congresswoman contacts the C1 today.

DHS Support to Civil Disturbances

Situational Overview

Portland, OR police were again working to restore traffic flow around the Justice Center (county property) and adjoining federal buildings Sunday night after protesters blocked an intersection. There were early morning social media reports of shots fired in Seattle's Capitol Hill Organized Protest (CHOP) zone, but no immediate indication of any injuries. Otherwise, there were no significant disturbances reported in key cities Saturday. There were no reports of attempts to remove any memorials, and no reported impacts to federal facilities. National Guard Bureau (NGB) state activations for civil disturbance support continue in seven states and DC, with (b)(7)(E) total activated personnel as of 29 Jun, down from a peak of (b)(7)(E) in 34 states on 7 Jun.

Locations of Interest

- **Portland, OR:** Protesters blocked roads around the Justice Center again Sunday night, following eight arrests on Saturday night after demonstrators pulled barriers into a main intersection there and resisted police efforts to remove them.
 - At 2010 PT FPS at the Edith Green-Wendell Wyatt Federal Building (FB) reported there were approximately (b)(7)(E) peaceful demonstrators in front of the adjacent (b)(7)(E)
 - At 2055 PT, FPS advised (b)(7)(E) demonstrators had blocked off the intersection in front of the Wyatt FB and Justice Center (SW 3rd Ave and Madison St). The protesters were otherwise peaceful. Portland Police and FPS were monitoring. By 2223 PT, the group had grown to 150 and the street was still blocked off. There were no reports of injury or impact to federal property.
 - A small explosion was reported at 1716 PT Sunday at a bus stop 6.5 miles east of the Justice Center area. TSA contacted Portland's public transportation organization (TriMet), who reported an individual running away after an altercation threw his backpack at the bus stop, resulting in a small explosion. Fireworks or an aerosol can in the backpack are believed to have exploded on impact. There were no injuries or damage, and no indications the explosion was deliberate or related to ongoing civil unrest. An investigation is ongoing.
- **Seattle, WA:** Protest activity was again relatively subdued, with no reported damage to federal facilities. There were early Monday morning (0130 PT) social media reports of shots fired in the Capitol Hill Occupied Protest (CHOP) zone, but no initial word of any injuries.
 - FPS reported at 2024 PT approximately 40 demonstrators in front of the Seattle Police Department West Precinct. By 2305 PT, the demonstrators had departed.
 - FBI reports The Seattle Mayor's office continues to negotiate with the CHOP zone leaders to dismantle the area and disperse; however, the attempted barrier removal on 26 Jun prompted a swell in the number of protesters from a couple dozen to more than 100.
- **Washington, DC:** There were no reports of injury or damage to federal facilities on Sunday. Among several other planned protests, a small group outside a business owner's Dupont Circle home remained peaceful.
 - On 28 Jun, NGB reported (b)(7)(E) activated in response to DC civil disturbances.

Other Locations

- **New York, NY:** Demonstrators continued to camp outside City Hall for a sixth day, demanding a \$1B+ cut to NYPD's budget. Many intend to remain at least until the city's budget is submitted, due on 30 Jun.
 - At 1229 ET, FPS reported 1,000 peaceful BLM demonstrators in downtown Manhattan. By 1319 ET, the gathering had grown to 10,000. No impacts to federal facilities were reported.
 - Protesters marched from Foley Square (near City Hall) to Washington Square Park (in Greenwich Village), where there were media reports of tensions with police around 1630 ET when one of the estimated 2,000 protesters there tried to mark up a police vehicle with graffiti. Some skirmishes and arrests ensued, prompting the use of pepper spray, but no reports of injuries or further incident.
 - At 1645 ET, NYC Emergency Management reported road closures and traffic delays due to the protest activity near Washington Square Park.
- **Richmond, VA:** Daily protest activity continues at the (b)(7)(E) Virginia State Police and the Richmond Police Department are staged in the area.
 - A 22-year-old male from Chesapeake, VA was arrested in Richmond after being stopped at 2130 ET on Saturday night for traveling the wrong way on a road near downtown Richmond. The driver attempted to flee but was taken into custody. Police found an active incendiary device, a hand saw, wooden shields, a gas mask, and a shovel fashioned into a spear in his vehicle. It is not known if the driver was or intended to be involved with demonstrations. The investigation is ongoing.
- **Minneapolis, MN:** All four terminated police officers in the George Floyd incident are scheduled for their second court appearance on 29 Jun at the Hennepin County Courthouse in Minneapolis. Two of the former officers were released on bond, two remain in custody.
- **Madison, WI:** There were no reports of injury, damage or violence on Sunday.
 - FBI reports on 29 Jun, there are reported concerns at the federal courthouse surrounding the upcoming sentencing of an individual currently on federal supervised release (this is not the activist whose arrest on 23 Jun sparked renewed violence in Madison).
 - On 28 Jun, NGB reported (b)(7)(E) Guardsmen activated in response to WI civil disturbances.
- **Reno, NV:** FBI reports the Washoe County District Attorney is anticipated to release a video on 29 or 30 Jun of a Sparks Police Department officer-involved shooting that could be controversial. Casino partners plan to increase security in anticipation of violence.
- **San Antonio, TX:** FPS reported a group of 100 gathered at the Alamo at 1724 CT. They remained off federal property, and left the area at 1724 CT, with no impact to federal facilities.
- **San Diego, CA:** FPS reported at 1505 PT, a group of 200 peaceful BLM protesters were across from federal property at the Hall of Justice, departing the area by 1517 ET as they marched along Broadway, escorted by local police.
- **Santa Fe, NM:** FPS reports seven FPS Officers remain deployed to enhance the protection of the Santiago E. Campos US Courthouse and the Kit Carson Obelisk located on federal property. There were no reported developments on Saturday.

CBP Statement:

"While the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) respects every American's right to protest peacefully, violence and civil unrest will not be tolerated. Violent anarchists have organized events in Portland over the last several weeks with willful intent to damage and destroy federal property, as well as, injure federal officers and agents. These criminal actions will not be tolerated.

CBP agents had information indicating the person in the video was suspected of assaults against federal agents or destruction of federal property. Once CBP agents approached the suspect, a large and violent mob moved towards their location. For everyone's safety, CBP agents quickly moved the suspect to a safer location for further questioning. The CBP agents identified themselves and were wearing CBP insignia during the encounter. The names of the agents were not displayed due to recent doxing incidents against law enforcement personnel who serve and protect our country.

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and its components will continue to work tirelessly to reestablish law and order. The Federal Protective Service (FPS) is the lead government agency to which CBP personnel are supporting. CBP personnel have been deployed to Portland in direct support of the Presidential Executive Order and the newly established DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT). CBP law enforcement personnel have been trained and cross designated under FPS legal authority 40 U.S.C. § 1315."
