Before the Court is Plaintiffs' Motion for Temporary Restraining Order And/Or Preliminary Injunctive Relief. (Dkt. No. 3.) Upon consideration of the Complaint (Dkt. No. 1), the Motion, and the supporting declarations (Dkt. Nos. 4, 5), for Good Cause Shown, the Court hereby **GRANTS** the Motion.

DISCUSSION

1
2 A temporary restraining order (“TRO”) is “an extraordinary remedy that may only
3 be awarded upon a clear showing that the plaintiff is entitled to such relief.” *Winter v.*
4 *Nat. Res. Def. Council*, 555 U.S. 7, 22 (2008). The purpose of a TRO is to preserve the
5 status quo before a preliminary injunction hearing may be held. *Granny Goose Foods,*
6 *Inc. v. Bhd. of Teamsters & Auto Truck Drivers Local No. 70 of Alameda City.*, 415 U.S.
7 423, 439 (1974). Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65 governs the issuance of TROs and
8 preliminary injunctions, and courts apply the same standard to both. *Frontline Med.*
9 *Assocs., Inc. v. Coventry Healthcare Workers Comp., Inc.*, 620 F. Supp. 2d 1109, 1110
10 (C.D. Cal. 2009).

11 A party seeking preliminary injunctive relief must satisfy one of two tests. Under
12 one test, the party must establish that he is (1) likely to succeed on the merits of his
13 claims, (2) that he is likely to suffer irreparable harm in the absence of preliminary relief,
14 (3) that the balance of equities tips in his favor, and (4) that an injunction is in the public
15 interest. *Am. Trucking Ass’n, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles*, 559 F.3d 1046, 1052 (9th Cir.
16 2009).

17 Under the alternative test, a party must show “‘serious questions going to the
18 merits’ [,] a balance of hardships that tips sharply toward the plaintiff,” a likelihood of
19 irreparable harm, and that the injunction is in the public interest. *Alliance for the Wild*
20 *Rockies v. Cottrell*, 632 F.3d 1127, 1132 (9th Cir. 2011). A “serious question” is one on
21 which the movant “has a fair chance of success on the merits.” *Sierra On-Line, Inc. v.*
22 *Phoenix Software, Inc.*, 739 F.2d 1415, 1421 (9th Cir. 1984).

23 The Court finds that Plaintiffs have satisfied these standards and that a TRO
24 should issue. Plaintiffs have satisfied the first test because they have shown that they are
25 likely to succeed on the merits of claims that would entitle them to relief; Plaintiffs are
26 likely to suffer irreparable harm in the absence of preliminary relief; the balance of
27 equities favors Plaintiffs; and an injunction is in the public interest. Plaintiffs have also
28 satisfied the “alternative” test: they have established at least a serious question going to

1 the merits of their claims; that the balance of hardships tips decisively in their favor; and,
2 as noted as to the first test, a likelihood of irreparable harm and that an injunction is in
3 the public interest.

4
5 **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

- 6 1. Defendants and their officers, agents, employees, attorneys, and all persons acting in
7 concert or participating with them, are **ENJOINED AND RESTRAINED** from
8 enforcing Defendant President Donald J. Trump's January 27, 2017 Executive Order
9 by removing, detaining, or blocking the entry of Plaintiffs, or any other person from
10 Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen with a valid immigrant visa;
11 2. Defendants, and Defendant United States Department of State in particular, are
12 hereby **ENJOINED AND RESTRAINED** from cancelling validly obtained and
13 issued immigrant visas of Plaintiffs;
14 3. Defendants, and Defendant United States Department of State in particular, are
15 hereby **ORDERED** to return to Plaintiffs their passports containing validly issued
16 immigrant visas so that Plaintiffs may travel to the United States on said visas; and
17 4. Defendants are hereby **ORDERED** to **IMMEDIATELY** inform all relevant airport,
18 airline, and other authorities at Los Angeles International Airport and International
19 Airport in Djibouti that Plaintiffs are permitted to travel to the United States on their
20 valid immigrant visas.

21
22 Unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties:

- 23 • Plaintiffs shall file any **supplemental brief** in support of their motion for
24 preliminary injunction **by February 2, 2017**.
25 • Defendants shall file their **opposition by February 5, 2017**.
26 • Plaintiffs shall file their **reply by February 8, 2017**.
27 • Defendants shall appear on **February 10, 2017 at 10:00 a.m.** to show cause why
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the preliminary injunctive relief sought in the Ex Parte Application for Temporary Restraining Order And/Or Preliminary Injunction should not be granted.

Summary:

On Saturday, January 29, 2017, planned protests at LAX are scheduled for 1100, 1200, and 1300 hours respectively, as per LAWA PD.

Update 7:

On Saturday, January 29, 2017, planned protests at LAX are scheduled for 1100, 1200, and 1300 hours respectively, as per LAWA PD. LAWA PD has coordinated with protest leaders and have designated the Lower Level near Parking Lot #4 on Center Way South to organize. Approximately 5,000 individuals are

expected. LAWA PD has significantly increased their staffing and have established a command post at LAFD Station 5 on Westchester pkwy. (b)(7)(E)
 (b)(7)(E) Updates will be provided when applicable.

Update 6:

As of 0015 hours on January 29, 2017, there are 986 individuals confirmed to attend a protest at TBIT at 1200 hours and 5,500 confirmed to attend at 1300 hours on January 29, 2017. (b)(7)(E) While the protest groups state that the protest will be peaceful and organized, (b)(7)(E)

The LAX Port Director continues to work in close coordination with LAWA PD. LAWA PD is currently reducing its footprint in preparation for the protests scheduled for later today. CBP TEOs will be deployed tomorrow. There continue to be approximately 100 protesters outside the FIS.

Update 5:

On January 28, 2017, at 2305 hours, the LAX Port Director met with Los Angeles City Attorney (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and escorted him into the outer egress area of the FIS. Prior to the meeting, the City Attorney was engaging with and encouraging a large group of protesters outside the FIS, and the LAWA PD Chief was growing increasingly concerned about the security situation as a result of the City Attorney's presence and inflammatory rhetoric. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was demanding information regarding the number of passengers being detained, and under what authority they were being detained, how many had been deported, and was LAX implementing the ruling out of New York. The LAX Port Director advised him that at this time he could not provide any specific data, was aware of the ruling earlier in the evening, was awaiting further guidance and would pass his contact info and request for information along to OCA. It was reported that Congresswomen Barragan and Chu had recently departed the area.

Update 4:

On January 28, 2017, at 2225 hours, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) the Chief of the Criminal Division of the U.S. Attorney's Office, arrived at the airport and was requesting information regarding passengers being detained. He was advised by the Watch Commander to contact PAO (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) LAWA PD Chief (b)(6) also advised the Watch Commander that his officers were continuing to keep protesters from breaching the FIS.

Update 3:

On January 28, 2017, at 2210 hours, LAWA PD reported that the protesters are becoming aggressive. TEOs remain in place and in radio contact with LAWA PD in the event of a breach or if they require assistance. The transit exit will be closed at 2210 hours to limit access to the FIS.

Update 2:

On January 28, 2017, at 2115 hours, LAX management was advised that Congresswomen Nanette Barragan and Judy Chu were on site at the TBIT departures level and seen talking to the media. Approximately 100 protesters remained in the area. CBP also received a call from the Channel 2 media inquiring why PIO was closed and were advised that PIO was still operating, however at an alternate location due to the noise and distraction resulting from the protest activity.

At approximately 2130 hours, it was reported that the protesters, including the Congresswomen and media, have moved downstairs to the arrivals level outside the FIS egress. The protest has become less organized, with

people milling about. LAWA PD has staged officers near the egress to prevent them from entering the FIS. TEOs remain deployed in the internal egress area of the FIS. The LAX Port Director continues to coordinate with LAWA PD.

Update 1:

On January 28, 2017, at 1853 hours PST, LAS was notified by the McCarran International Airport Control Center that they received information of protesters at the Terminal 3 parking garage. The McCarran Airport Director also contacted the LAS Port Director to advise that she received information that protesters were at Terminal 3 and that media may be present as well. The LAS Port Director arrived at the FIS to address protesters. There were approximately twelve protesters outside of the FIS exit point. They did not have signs and were not verbally aggressive. One protester, who identified herself as (b)(6) Legal Director of the ACLU of Nevada, stated that her main concern was whether CBP had any passengers that were currently being detained in our custody. The LAS Port Director provided CBP PIO information to Ms (b)(6) but no other information. No media was present in the area. Six Las Vegas Metropolitan Police were present at the scene and stated that media presence was at the domestic baggage claim area. There was no impact to CBP operations.

Details:

On Friday, January 27, 2017, the President signed an Executive Order entitled "*Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States*". The Executive Order suspends the entry of citizens from Iran, Libya, Syria, Iraq, Yemen, Somalia, and Sudan into the U.S.

On January 28, 2017, attorneys, private citizens and members of the media began to arrive at the Public Information Office (PIO) at the Tom Bradley International Terminal (TBIT). The CBP Officer assigned to PIO advised the inquiring parties to contact the Office Public Affairs. Due to the size of the crowd, a Supervisory CBPO and additional CBPOs were deployed to PIO to assist. The SCBPO and additional CBPOs handed OPA contact information to the inquiring parties. The PIO, which normally is staffed from 0700-2300 hours, was closed at 1700 due to security concerns related to the protest.

Between 1600 and 1700 hours, approximately 150 protestors arrived and began holding an organized vigil outside the TBIT departure level. There are six media vans and reporters are interviewing both passengers and protestors. There is no CBP presence in the area.

The Los Angeles World Airport (LAWA) Police Department has deployed an enhanced visible presence in the area.

CBP has deployed a limited (b)(7)(E)

Attorneys advertising their services and holding signs are lingering in the PIO area.

The LAX Port Director, LAWA PD Chief and the LAWA Executive Director are in close communication.

Currently, two (2) additional protests are scheduled for January 29, 2017. Attendance estimates per social media indicate that at 1100 hours, 185 protesters will be at TBIT (no specific location) and at 1300 hours, 1,500 protesters will be at TBIT in the arrivals level.

CBP management at the Las Vegas International Airport (LAS) contacted the LAX Port Director and relayed information suggesting that there will be potential protests in Las Vegas in the days ahead. No further details at this time.

Councilmember Blumenfield introduced a motion for City Council consideration requesting information on the actions taking place at LAX as a result of Executive Order: Border Security and Immigration Enforcement. I've included a link below for your reference.

There is often confusion in these types of situations as to which jurisdiction is responsible for what and it is crucial to provide clarifying information. The councilmember will schedule this item to be heard before Innovation, Grants, Technology, Commerce and Trade Committee on Tuesday, February 7th at 1:00 p.m. in City Hall room 1010. While we understand U.S. Customs and Border Protection does not fall under the purview of the City of Los Angeles, your representation would be greatly appreciated to assist in keeping the constituents of Los Angeles abreast of the current situation while clarifying the relationship between Los Angeles World Airports and your department.

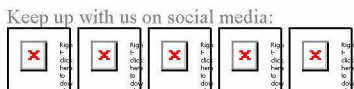

L.A. federal judge orders a temporary halt to Trump's travel ban

A federal judge in Los Angeles has added another legal challenge to President Trump's controversial suspension of travel from a group of predominantly Muslim countries, issuing an emergency order that forbids government officials from enforcing many of the new rules.

Using sweeping, unambiguous language, U.S. District Judge Andre Birotte Jr. on Tuesday night granted a temporary restraining order against the executive order Trump signed late last week.

Birotte's ruling came in a case hastily filed Tuesday on behalf of 28 Yemeni-born people. The group consists of United States citizens living here and family members who remained behind in Yemen but had received immigrant visas to come to the U.S., according to court filings.

Finding that the plaintiffs stand a good chance of prevailing when the case is heard in court and are "likely to suffer irreparable harm" if he didn't act, Birotte instructed that the plaintiffs be allowed entry into the U.S.

Birotte, however, went further, granting a request from the plaintiffs' lawyers that his ruling be applied to anyone trying to enter the U.S. on a valid immigrant visa from the seven countries included in Trump's ban.

The executive order, which Trump has said will better protect the country against terrorist attacks, blocks citizens from Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen from coming to the U.S. for at least 90 days. It also imposes a ban for 120 days on refugees from any country entering the U.S. and bars refugees from Syria indefinitely.

Critics of the ban have expressed concern it will do little to improve security while alienating Muslims.

Birotte's order did not address people trying to enter the country as refugees or on non-immigrant visas, such as tourists.

The president's order, which a recent poll showed is supported by about half of Americans, was issued on Friday and met with angry protests and confusion at several U.S. airports as border control officers refused entry to hundreds of people and detained others for long periods as they scrambled to understand the scope of the new rules.

Whether Birotte's order will have any impact is an open question. A handful of federal judges elsewhere in the country have already issued rulings that blocked aspects of the executive order, but it is unclear whether they have been followed. In one of the rulings, a judge in New York on Saturday ordered a halt to deportations of travelers who arrived at airports with valid visas to enter the U.S. countries. Despite that order, however, reports surfaced in Los Angeles and elsewhere of people being turned back.

Notably, in his ruling, Birotte forbade federal officials from "removing, detaining, or blocking the entry" of affected travelers or "cancelling validly obtained and issued immigrant visas of plaintiffs." The wording would seem to mean that government officials would not be allowed to continue the practice of instructing airlines and border officials in other countries to stop immigrants from the affected countries from boarding planes bound for the U.S.

Calls to the Department of Justice were not immediately returned.

25 Preliminary Injunctive Relief. (Dkt. No. 3.) Upon consideration of the Complaint (Dkt.
26 No. 1), the Motion, and the supporting declarations (Dkt. Nos. 4, 5), for Good Cause
27 Shown, the Court hereby **GRANTS** the Motion.

DISCUSSION

1
2 A temporary restraining order (“TRO”) is “an extraordinary remedy that may only
3 be awarded upon a clear showing that the plaintiff is entitled to such relief.” *Winter v.*
4 *Nat. Res. Def. Council*, 555 U.S. 7, 22 (2008). The purpose of a TRO is to preserve the
5 status quo before a preliminary injunction hearing may be held. *Granny Goose Foods,*
6 *Inc. v. Bhd. of Teamsters & Auto Truck Drivers Local No. 70 of Alameda City.*, 415 U.S.
7 423, 439 (1974). Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65 governs the issuance of TROs and
8 preliminary injunctions, and courts apply the same standard to both. *Frontline Med.*
9 *Assocs., Inc. v. Coventry Healthcare Workers Comp., Inc.*, 620 F. Supp. 2d 1109, 1110
10 (C.D. Cal. 2009).

11 A party seeking preliminary injunctive relief must satisfy one of two tests. Under
12 one test, the party must establish that he is (1) likely to succeed on the merits of his
13 claims, (2) that he is likely to suffer irreparable harm in the absence of preliminary relief,
14 (3) that the balance of equities tips in his favor, and (4) that an injunction is in the public
15 interest. *Am. Trucking Ass’n, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles*, 559 F.3d 1046, 1052 (9th Cir.
16 2009).

17 Under the alternative test, a party must show “‘serious questions going to the
18 merits’ [,] a balance of hardships that tips sharply toward the plaintiff,” a likelihood of
19 irreparable harm, and that the injunction is in the public interest. *Alliance for the Wild*
20 *Rockies v. Cottrell*, 632 F.3d 1127, 1132 (9th Cir. 2011). A “serious question” is one on
21 which the movant “has a fair chance of success on the merits.” *Sierra On-Line, Inc. v.*
22 *Phoenix Software, Inc.*, 739 F.2d 1415, 1421 (9th Cir. 1984).

23 The Court finds that Plaintiffs have satisfied these standards and that a TRO
24 should issue. Plaintiffs have satisfied the first test because they have shown that they are
25 likely to succeed on the merits of claims that would entitle them to relief; Plaintiffs are
26 likely to suffer irreparable harm in the absence of preliminary relief; the balance of
27 equities favors Plaintiffs; and an injunction is in the public interest. Plaintiffs have also
28 satisfied the “alternative” test: they have established at least a serious question going to

1 the merits of their claims; that the balance of hardships tips decisively in their favor; and,
2 as noted as to the first test, a likelihood of irreparable harm and that an injunction is in
3 the public interest.

4
5 **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

- 6 1. Defendants and their officers, agents, employees, attorneys, and all persons acting in
7 concert or participating with them, are **ENJOINED AND RESTRAINED** from
8 enforcing Defendant President Donald J. Trump's January 27, 2017 Executive Order
9 by removing, detaining, or blocking the entry of Plaintiffs, or any other person from
10 Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen with a valid immigrant visa;
11 2. Defendants, and Defendant United States Department of State in particular, are
12 hereby **ENJOINED AND RESTRAINED** from cancelling validly obtained and
13 issued immigrant visas of Plaintiffs;
14 3. Defendants, and Defendant United States Department of State in particular, are
15 hereby **ORDERED** to return to Plaintiffs their passports containing validly issued
16 immigrant visas so that Plaintiffs may travel to the United States on said visas; and
17 4. Defendants are hereby **ORDERED** to **IMMEDIATELY** inform all relevant airport,
18 airline, and other authorities at Los Angeles International Airport and International
19 Airport in Djibouti that Plaintiffs are permitted to travel to the United States on their
20 valid immigrant visas.

22 Unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties:

- 23 • Plaintiffs shall file any **supplemental brief** in support of their motion for
24 preliminary injunction **by February 2, 2017**.
25 • Defendants shall file their **opposition by February 5, 2017**.
26 • Plaintiffs shall file their **reply by February 8, 2017**.
27 • Defendants shall appear on **February 10, 2017 at 10:00 a.m.** to show cause why
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the preliminary injunctive relief sought in the Ex Parte Application for Temporary Restraining Order And/Or Preliminary Injunction should not be granted.

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**DHS Senior Leader Brief
Executive Order Implementation
0600 ET 30 January 2017**

Overview

Updates in Bold and Blue

On 27 January, 2017, the President of the United States signed the Executive Order (EO) Protecting the Nation from Terrorist Attacks by Foreign Nationals. Effective immediately in accordance with the EO, entry into the U.S. is suspended for the next 90 days for all immigrants and non-immigrants from Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen.

On 28 January, while implementing the EO, less than 1 percent of the more than 325,000 international air travelers who arrive every day were inconvenienced by the enhanced security measures.

This suspension does not affect foreign nationals traveling on diplomatic visas, NATO visas, and select other visas outlined in the EO.

Department Actions

Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Since 2000 ET, January 27:

- Total number of encounters at ports of entry – 735, which includes 394 LPRs who are being considered for waivers.
- Total number of individuals denied boarding prior to departure – 348 (186 non-immigrant visa holders; 162 immigrant visa holders).
- Number of individuals denied entry into US – approximately 200-250 depending on the number of exceptions granted.
- LPRs Refused Entry – 2
 - One who withdrew their request at the land border.
 - One who entered into proceedings for a criminal record.
- Individuals who still must complete admissibility processing: 2 (as of 1730, January 29)

- Way ahead: Joint DHS/DOS waivers granted for 872 refugees arriving this coming week.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)

- USCIS will continue with scheduled refugee interviews for religious minorities, but discontinue interviews in South Africa where the refugee population is predominantly from Sudan and Somalia.
- Circuit Ride scheduled for early February to Australia will proceed as planned.

U.S. Coast Guard (USCG)

- Coast Guard identified four vessels with a total of **36** individuals affected by the EO.
 - **The Motor Tanker (M/T) EMBDENS WELVAART arrived in Corpus Christi, TX on 27 January with 1 Syrian crewmember aboard.**
 - The Motor Vessel (M/V) ZAD ELKHIR arrived in Chester, PA on 27 January, with 9 crewmembers of Syrian nationality.

- The M/V EMBDENS WELVAART arrived in Corpus Christi, TX on 25 January, with 1 Syrian crewmember aboard.
- The M/V ATLANTIC M is scheduled to arrive in Wilmington, DE on 30 January, at 0600 ET, with 24 Syrian crewmembers.
- The Cruise Ship (C/S) NORWEGIAN SKY is scheduled to arrive in Miami, FL on 30 January, at 0700 ET, with 1 Iranian national crewmember.
- The foreign nationals identified above have not requested entry, but the Captains of the Port are requiring Ship Security Officers to have measures in place to ensure the individuals remain aboard their respective vessels.

Office of Legislative Affairs (OLA)

- Received 78 inquiries.

Office of Public Affairs (OPA)

- Produced DHS Fact Sheet (see attachment)

Office Policy (PLCY)

- PLCY is coordinating S1 telephone calls with United Kingdom's Home Secretary, Amber Rudd, and Canada's Minister of Public Safety, Ralph Goodale, regarding implementation of the EO.
- U.S Embassy Qatar is reporting their government contacts are concerned that implementing the EO will lead to increased jihadist recruitment, be a boost for ISIL, and embolden Iranian activity in Iraq.
- U.S. Embassy UAE is reporting questions on the applicability of the EO to LPRs and dual nationals.

Office of General Counsel (OGC)

- OGC is monitoring and tracking legal challenges implicating the Executive Order.

Office of Partnership and Engagement (OPE)

- OPE received **38** inquiries from state, local, and private-sector partners; and academia. They have responded to **7** so far. The 2 most common questions focus on the number of affected individuals and guidance regarding work visas.

Transportation Security Administration (TSA)

- **San Francisco International Airport closed 2 checkpoints due to the proximity of protestors. Passengers directed to alternate checkpoints. There was no breach of the sterile area and no impact to flight operations.**
- DHS Federal Security Directors are closely coordinating with Airport Directors and local law enforcement leadership.
- Impact to screening operations: The Raleigh-Durham Airport closed the terminal-2 checkpoint due to the proximity of approximately 1000 protestors. The sterile area has not been breached and addition law enforcement officers are being brought in—this shutdown will impact flight operations.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)

- **International Operations – Visa Security Program**
 - **HSI Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates (UAE): Approximately 25% of applications and cases impacted.**
 - **HSI Dubai (UAE): Approximately 50% of applications and cases impacted.**

- To date, the Office of Partnership and Engagement (OPE) has received 38 inquiries from SLTT, academia, and the private sector stakeholders concerning the Executive Order on border security, immigration enforcement, and refugees. 7 of the inquiries have been completed, and the remaining inquiry responses are awaiting additional information. OPE has also proactively distributed all of the Secretary's Statements regarding the Executive Order to stakeholders.
- With regards to the Executive Order on Protecting the Nation From Foreign Terrorist Entry Into the United States, the most common inquiries include:
 - Information requests on the number of individuals being affected in their specific jurisdictions; and
 - Guidance for employers on work visas (to include inquiries from large tech companies such as Microsoft and Apple).
- Inquiries came from the offices of the Governor of New York and the Governor of Virginia on several issues, including questions about travelers being prohibited from entering the country via airports in their respective states. Both were notified this evening that all travelers have been processed.

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DHS Senior Leader Brief Executive Order Implementation 0600 ET 30 January 2017

Updates in Bold and Blue

Overview

On 27 January, 2017, the President of the United States signed the Executive Order (EO) Protecting the Nation from Terrorist Attacks by Foreign Nationals. Effective immediately in accordance with the EO, entry into the U.S. is suspended for the next 90 days for all immigrants and non-immigrants from Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen.

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- Individuals who still must complete admissibility processing: 2 (as of 1730, January 29)
- Way ahead: Joint DHS/DOS waivers granted for 872 refugees arriving this coming week.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)

- USCIS will continue with scheduled refugee interviews for religious minorities, but discontinue interviews in South Africa where the refugee population is predominantly from Sudan and Somalia.
- Circuit Ride scheduled for early February to Australia will proceed as planned.

U.S. Coast Guard (USCG)

- Coast Guard identified four vessels with a total of **36** individuals affected by the EO.
 - **The Motor Tanker (M/T) EMBDENS WELVAART arrived in Corpus Christi, TX on 27 January with 1 Syrian crewmember aboard.**
 - The Motor Vessel (M/V) ZAD ELKHIR arrived in Chester, PA on 27 January, with 9 crewmembers of Syrian nationality.

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- The M/V EMBDENS WELVAART arrived in Corpus Christi, TX on 25 January, with 1 Syrian crewmember aboard.
- The M/V ATLANTIC M is scheduled to arrive in Wilmington, DE on 30 January, at 0600 ET, with 24 Syrian crewmembers.
- The Cruise Ship (C/S) NORWEGIAN SKY is scheduled to arrive in Miami, FL on 30 January, at 0700 ET, with 1 Iranian national crewmember.
- The foreign nationals identified above have not requested entry, but the Captains of the Port are requiring Ship Security Officers to have measures in place to ensure the individuals remain aboard their respective vessels.

Office Policy (PLCY)

- PLCY is coordinating S1 telephone calls with United Kingdom's Home Secretary, Amber Rudd, and Canada's Minister of Public Safety, Ralph Goodale, regarding implementation of the EO.
- U.S Embassy Qatar is reporting their government contacts are concerned that implementing the EO will lead to increased jihadist recruitment, be a boost for ISIL, and embolden Iranian activity in Iraq.
- U.S. Embassy UAE is reporting questions on the applicability of the EO to LPRs and dual nationals.

Office of General Counsel (OGC)

- OGC is monitoring and tracking legal challenges implicating the Executive Order.

Office of Partnership and Engagement (OPE)

- OPE received **38** inquiries from state, local, and private-sector partners; and academia. They have responded to **7** so far. The 2 most common questions focus on the number of affected individuals and guidance regarding work visas.

Transportation Security Administration (TSA)

- **San Francisco International Airport closed 2 checkpoints due to the proximity of protestors. Passengers directed to alternate checkpoints. There was no breach of the sterile area and no impact to flight operations.**
- DHS Federal Security Directors are closely coordinating with Airport Directors and local law enforcement leadership.
- Impact to screening operations: The Raleigh-Durham Airport closed the terminal-2 checkpoint due to the proximity of approximately 1000 protestors. The sterile area has not been breached and additional law enforcement officers are being brought in—this shutdown will impact flight operations.
