Please see below and suspend enforcement of the EO based on the guidance below immediately.

A federal district court has issued a nationwide injunction of certain provisions of the January 27, 2017 Executive Order on Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States. The injunction is effective right now and compliance with the ruling must begin immediately. Accordingly, we will suspend any and all actions implementing the affected sections of the Executive Order 13769 entitled, "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (January 27, 2017). We have been instructed to immediately resume inspection of travelers in accordance with previous standard policy and procedure.

The attached letter from the Department of State reverses the provisional revocation of visas.

WASHINGTON – In applying the provisions of the president's executive order, I hereby deem the entry of lawful permanent residents to be in the national interest.

Accordingly, absent the receipt of significant derogatory information indicating a serious threat to public safety and welfare, lawful permanent resident status will be a dispositive factor in our case-by-case determinations.

Executive Order (EO): Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States (1/27/2017)

All entry of aliens who are nationals (citizens) of Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, and Yemen is suspended and their visas have been temporarily suspended. This includes

- all non-immigrant classifications with the exception of foreign nationals traveling on visas classified as Diplomatic (A1, A2,), NATO, C2, G1, G2, G3, and G4;
- all immigrant classifications, including new immigrants, returning lawful permanent residents (commuters as well), refugees, and asylees.

Applicants bearing Non-Immigrant Visas and First Time Arriving Immigrants:

- Make sure these folks are referred to secondary. A (b)(7)(E) is not required.
- Only contact (b)(7)(E) during system checks and/or interviews.
- Insure all required database queries are conducted, including a (b)(7)(E)
- All case processing will be recorded in (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) according to current policy/procedure.
- Subjects will be allowed to withdraw their application for admission on Form I-160A. Processing officers will not be required to take a sworn statement or open an Alien File. Further, the aliens visa should not be physically cancelled or marked in any way, because the visa is temporarily suspended.
- Use INA charge 212(a)(7)(B)(i)(II) and a disposition code of AR.
- Should the alien decline to withdraw their application for admission, the alien will be placed in Expedited Removal in accordance with standard operating procedures.
- Aliens claiming fear of return will be referred to an asylum officer, and processed for Expedited Removal/Credible Fear (ERF). Per current procedures. Indicate to both CIS and ERO that aliens are subject to Executive Order during the referral process.

Returning Residents

Lawful Permanent Residents should be referred for (b)(7)(E) and held until an exemption to the Executive Order is granted. Only contact (b)(7)(E) during system checks and/or interviews. The authority to grant an exemption has been delegated to Directors of Field Operations. A WC will contact the Port Director who will contact the DFO for exemption approval. Results of (b)(7)(E) resulting in approved exemptions should be notated in (b)(7)(E) with the following language: Individual is subject to Presidential Executive Order and barred from entry pursuant to 212(f) of the INA but has been granted an exemption per (DFO Perry). (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E)

Lawful Permanent residents who are deemed ineligible for exemption due to actual derogatory information in removal proceedings should be placed in section 240 removal proceedings with charge of 212(f).

Refugees (including 1st time encountered), Asylees, Unaccompanied Alien Children(UAC), and subjects returning to the US with I-512 issued by US CIS (Advanced Parole):

Aliens from the above group who are prevented from entry solely as a result of the Executive Order, should be referred for (b)(7)(E) and held at the port of entry until such time as an exemption to the Executive Order can be obtained. Only contact (b)(7)(E) during system checks and/or interviews. Waiver authority for these travelers is delegated to the CBP Commissioner. To request a waiver for this classification of traveler submit the request via email to the following: DFO Chris Perry, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and the Detroit Field Office WC mailbox. The waiver request will be forwarded as appropriate by the Detroit Field Office Watch Commander.

Parole or Deferral not authorized

Individuals who fall within any of the above may not be paroled, which includes port parole and deferred inspection. To the extent that there is an emergent medical issue related to an alien who falls within the Executive Order, CBP officers must accompany the alien for any medical care.

Travelers not Seeking Entry

The Executive order does not apply to individuals not making entry into the United States. Travelers not seeking entry into the United States would include, but not limited to, those denied entry into Canada and returned to the United States, lost travelers, aliens who walk in off the street to ask question. Remember other immigration actions may be appropriate even though the Executive Order does not apply.

Evidence of Citizenship

US Resident Alien Cards (I-551) indicate a place of birth, not citizenship. If a lawful permanent resident presents an I-551 card that indicates birth in one of the countries subject to the EO, but is able to present a passport indicating citizenship in a country not subject to the EO, that individual is not subject to the EO.

Pursuant to section 101(a)(30) of the INA. The term passport means any travel document issued by competent authority showing the bearer's origin, identity, and nationality, if any, which is valid for the admission of the bearer into a foreign country. This definition would include reentry permits issued by United States CIS.

NEXUS

Lift all NEXUS cards that are in the possession of nationals of Iraq, Iran, Syria, Sudan, Libya, Yemen or Somalia, including US Permanent Resident Aliens and Canadian Landed Immigrants. Officers will send these cards to the Trusted Traveler Enrollment Center for disposition.

Enrollment Centers will revoke these cards to maintain a log of all PASS IDs and names of the revoked individuals. Enrollment center officers must not shred these cards, the Center supervisor will take custody. In the comment section for the revocation, the Enrollment Center Officer's must state "Revocation due to President Trump's Immigration Executive Order - 20170127".

Inquiries

Operational questions should be addressed by station supervisor. We will not address policy questions or what if questions. If a supervisor cannot answer a question they should refer the matter to a chief or WC.

Media inquires should be directed to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

Congressional Inquiries should be directed to the Detroit Field Office.

Inquiries from members of AILA chapters should be directed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) at AILA National.

Professionalism

Our professionalism is very important. We should be deliberate in our choice of words and communication on this subject. Media reports are coming out suggesting CBPOs are advising people to contact Mr. Trump if they have questions. This is not acceptable. We should be professional in our communication, explain as best as we can, direct to a supervisor or public affairs if necessary. We have a job to do but we need to ensure our professionalism so we are not part of the story.

Reporting

Reporting for the 20170127 Executive Order is a cumulative report. Send reports to the FO WC. Each report (0400, 1400 and 2000 hours) will be a running total to include the encounters from all prior reports; the reporting numbers will not reset each day. For the 2000 hours report, include the encounters from the previous reports today.

The attached letter from the Department of State reverses the provisional revocation of visas.

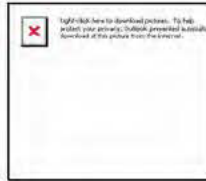
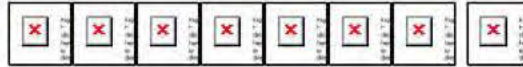

celebrate our differences and reveal to the world the beautiful kaleidoscope of human diversity.

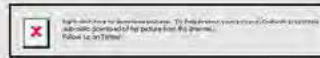

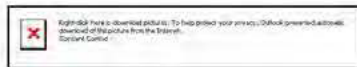

Executive Order (EO) *Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States*

- On 27 January 2017, the President of the United States signed Executive Order (EO) *Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States*.
 - Effective immediately in accordance with the new EO, all immigrant and nonimmigrant persons of Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen are suspended entry into the U.S. for the next 90 days.
- The suspension does not affect foreign nationals traveling on diplomatic visas, NATO visas, C-2 visas for travel to the United Nations and G-1, G-2, G-3 and G-4.
- U.S. Lawful Permanent Residents (green card holders)
 - In accordance with White House Guidance issued on February 1, 2017, Sections 3(c) and 3(e) of Executive Order Entitled “Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States” do not apply to Lawful Permanent Residents.
- Dual citizens: EO applies to Dual Citizens, but travelers are being treated according to the travel document they present. For example, if they present a Canadian passport, that is how they are processed for entry.
- Someone who is in the Federal Inspection Area right now: Each person who may be admissible from one of the seven countries, has to have an individual waiver. Processing the waivers may delay the release of the individual.
- What about refugees who are considered to be “in transit?”
 - There are currently 872 refugees who are considered to be in transit who are scheduled to arrive in the United States this week. The Secretaries of State and DHS have coordinated and will process the 872 individuals consistent with the terms of the Executive Order, which we’ve operationalized by assessing each traveler on a case-by-case basis.
- Documents that can be used by citizens identified by the EO to enter the United States are:
 - Any diplomatic visa (A, G, C-2, or NATO)
 - An I-551 (Green Card)
 - An advance parole document
 - Any SQ immigrant visa

If they are not in possession of one of the above travel documents, they will not be allowed to enter the U.S.

In addition to the timely reporting at 0400 hours, 1400 hours and 2000 hours (CST) please see the following bullets:

- Returning Residents:**
 Port Directors or there designees are to forward **bullets to DFO White** requesting an exemption for the LPR and a short detail of the examination, copying in ADFO (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and the Admissibility team (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)
- Stakeholders**
 In light of the changes that were made with the new executive order and our current operational stance, **Port Directors at larger locations engage directly, today, with local stakeholders** to explain the changes and answer any questions as necessary. The focus for this should be at our larger airport operations.
- Detaining a Returning Refugee**
 Due to the President of the United States Executive Order, if your port detains a returning refugee, the Field Liaison Division will need **bullets** for each encounter as soon as possible. This information is time sensitive and will be forwarded to C1, C2, EAC, DEAC, XD Ops, DXD Ops, XD (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) XD Hoffman and DXD Hutton.
- To ensure clarity and avoid confusion, Afghanistan was not subject to the EO. In addition, Refugees coming from another country, e.g. Mongolia, not listed in the guidance should be processed as normal.

Subject: Guidance on Executive Order "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States"

Effective immediately, and pursuant to Executive Order entitled, *"Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States"* (January 27, 2017), all entry into the United States for aliens who are nationals from Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen is hereby suspended in accordance with Section 212(f) of the INA. This includes all non-immigrant classifications, with the exception of those foreign nationals traveling on diplomatic visas, NATO visas, C2 visas for travel to the United Nations, G1, G2, G-3, and G-4 visas. This also includes all immigrant classes of admission, returning resident aliens refugees and asylees.

The Department to State has provided CBP with a letter provisionally revoking all immigrant and non-immigrant visas for nationals of Iran, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, and Yemen. Revocations may not yet be annotated in the system.

Wherever possible, (b)(7)(E) will coordinate the denial of boarding through (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) locations, and (b)(7)(E)

Should aliens, subject to the Executive Order, arrive at the port of entry, CBP officers are instructed to take the following actions:

Applicants bearing Non-Immigrant Visas and First Time Arriving Immigrants:

- (1) All case processing will be recorded in (b)(7)(E) system, according to current policy/procedure.
- (2) Subjects will be allowed to withdraw their application for admission on Form I-275, **without a sworn statement**. All other procedures pertaining to the processing of Form I-275 withdrawal cases apply.

- (3) Should the alien decline to withdraw their application for admission, the alien will be placed in Expedited Removal in accordance with standard operating procedures.
- (4) Aliens claiming fear of return will be referred to an asylum officer, and processed for Expedited Removal/Credible Fear (ERF). Aliens processed under ERF procedures will be referred to ERO for detention. Field Offices should clearly indicate to both CIS and ERO that aliens are subject to Executive Order during the referral process.

Returning Residents,

- (1) Lawful Permanent Residents should be referred for (b)(7)(E) and held at the port of entry until an exemption to the Executive Order is granted. The authority to grant an exemption has been delegated to the Commissioner of CBP, and further delegated to Directors of Field Operations and SES Port Directors. Once an exemption has been granted results of (b)(7)(E) should be notated in (b)(7)(E) with the following language: *Individual is subject to Presidential Executive Order and barred from entry pursuant to 212(f) of the INA but has been granted an exemption per (insert DFO/SES PD).*

Refugees, Asylees, Unaccompanied Children, and subjects returning to the US with Advanced Parole:

- (1) Aliens from the above group who are prevented from entry solely as a result of the Executive Order, should be referred for (b)(7)(E) and held at the port of entry until such time as an exemption to the Executive Order can be obtained. This exemption falls to the Secretary of State and Secretary of Homeland Security. Further guidance will be forthcoming on processing these exemptions.

Individuals who fall within any of the above may not be paroled, which includes port parole and deferred inspection. To the extent that there is an emergent medical issue related to an alien who falls within the Executive Order, CBP officers must accompany the alien for any medical care.

Returning aliens ineligible who withdraw their application for admission:

- (1) Aliens arriving via air or sea: Commercial carriers are required to remove foreign aliens found ineligible for entry under this order pursuant to 241(c)(1) of the INA.
- (2) Aliens arriving via land will be returned per current established procedures with the contiguous country.

All,

Please see the report below:

Executive Summary:

On Sunday 1/29/17, approximately 4,000 protestors engaged in a civil protest at the Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW). The subject of the protest was the President's Executive Order: PROTECTING THE NATION FROM FOREIGN TERRORIST ENTRY INTO THE UNITED STATES. CBP was provided advance notice from the Wayne County Airport Authority (WCAA) a permit had been granted to allow protestors to gather at designated spots between 1600 and 1800 hours. The Port Director met with WCAA Police and the TSA Federal Security Director (FSD) to discuss areas acceptable to these agencies for designated protest areas. It was made clear CBP desired not to have any designated areas adjacent to the Federal Inspection Services (FIS) area. The Detroit Field Office provided (b)(7)(E) and a (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) to assist with surveillance of all public areas adjacent to the FIS. The (b)(7)(E) was present and had 10 agents on hand to provide a rapid-response team if required.

All CBP personnel were mandated (b)(7)(E) FIS. CBP personnel were instructed not to engage with any protestors they may encounter, the importance of maintaining the utmost professionalism was repeatedly emphasized. Personnel were reminded not to comment on CBP policy, and to direct any media inquiries to the Detroit Field Office Public Affairs Liaison (PAL). A full briefing with all available personnel was held by the Port Director at 1430 hours. Clear directions were provided regarding all security assignments and communication protocols.

As the protest progressed, the crowd size grew rapidly to approximately 4,000 protestors. All permitted areas outside and inside the McNamara terminal were filled beyond capacity. The crowd had taken over the Domestic Baggage Claim area and were blocking all points of entrance and egress. At 1800 hours, WCAA informed the protest organizers their permitted time had expired. The crowd did not disperse as directed. The remaining protestors became increasingly disobedient, but not violent. WCAA Police then requested assistance from CBP. Six plain-clothes officers led by a Chief SCBPO were dispatched to serve in a support role to WCAA Police. CBPOs were only authorized to display their badges to identify them as law enforcement personnel. No branding was displayed. The protestors soon began to disperse and CBP assets were immediately recalled to the FIS. By 1930 hours, the protestors had vacated all DTW areas of operation. CBP operations were not affected at any time. No arrests were made.

Details:

On 1/28/17, social media chatter called for an organized protest at border crossings and international airports including DTW on 1/29/17.

WCAA Police strategically designated five protest areas. Three of the designated protest areas were outside and two were interior on the domestic baggage claim level.

The WCAA Emergency Command Center (ECC) was activated prior to the scheduled protest; CBP was present.

An [REDACTED] (b)(7)(E) was established to allow law enforcement partners to communicate efficiently.

A recurring conference call was established to provide updates; CBP participated in the calls.

At approximately 1700 hours, the crowd size was estimated at 1,300-1,500 protesters. The protesters began to overflow the designated protest areas which affected traffic.

CBP Officers [REDACTED] (b)(7)(E) any protesters overflow into the international arrivals lobby. This overflow did not happen.

CBP personnel [REDACTED] (b)(7)(E) and the [REDACTED] (b)(7)(E) to provide the incident commander with updates.

Michigan State Police (MSP) dispatched personnel to assist with traffic control.

Local and national media outlets featured footage of the protest at DTW.

At 1800 hours, WCAA Police and the Airline made announcements to inform the crowd the designated protest time had expired.

At approximately 1855 hours, the remaining crowd decreased to approximately 100 protesters.

At 1930 hours, all protesters had departed the terminal.

At approximately 2000 hours, the final conference call was completed and the ECC was stood down.

No arrests were made during the protest at DTW.
