Dear Jeffrey,

Please see below an important message from Jeffrey Shane, Legal Committee Secretary and IATA General Counsel:

The U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington, in Seattle, today issued a temporary restraining order prohibiting U.S. Customs and Border Protection from implementing or enforcing the January 27 Executive Order establishing new U.S. travel restrictions until the case can be heard and decided on the merits. The case is different from others to date because it was brought by a state government -- the State of Washington – and because the order applies nationwide.

Doug Lavin and I just participated in a conference call with CBP in which the agency confirmed that it will shortly issue a statement saying unequivocally that enforcement of the Executive Order will be suspended immediately and that all travelers who were eligible to travel to the United States prior to its issuance will

now be permitted to travel to the United States in keeping with the law as it existed pre-Executive Order. The CBP official on the call said that, as a result of the Seattle TRO, "it is business as usual in terms of entry into the United States" and "it is as if the Executive Order never existed." I asked specifically whether online visa validation systems would reflect the reversal, noting that a great many "do not board" messages seem to be appearing even for passengers protected by earlier court orders. The CBP official said that, in keeping with the Seattle TRO, the State Department has rescinded its revocations of visas. Where a "do not board" message appears, however, airline personnel should act in keeping with the message as it may be attributable to unrelated issues with the traveler.


We have not yet seen a copy of the TRO. It is not clear yet when the court will hear the case. Accordingly, it is difficult to predict with any confidence how long the current suspension will last. For the time being, however, normal (i.e., pre-Executive Order) screening procedures are being restored.

IATA is notifying member airlines of this important development through all of its usual contact lists.

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



Attached please find the guidance which we have just received from the White House counsel, Donald F. McGahn.

It states in pertinent part (key portion highlighted):

Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.



Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.



Executive Order (EO) Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States

- On 27 January 2017, the President of the United States signed Executive Order (EO) Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States.
 - Effective immediately in accordance with the new EO, all immigrant and nonimmigrant persons of Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen <u>are suspended entry</u> into the U.S. for the next 90 days.
- The suspension does not affect foreign nationals traveling on diplomatic visas, NATO visas, C-2 visas for travel to the United Nations and G-1, G-2, G-3 and G-4.
- U.S. Lawful Permanent Residents (green card holders)
 - O In accordance with White House Guidance issued on February 1, 2017, Sections 3(c) and 3(e) of Executive Order Entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" do not apply to Lawful Permanent Residents.
- Dual citizens: EO applies to Dual Citizens, but travelers are being treated according to the travel document they present. For example, if they present a Canadian passport, that is how they are processed for entry.
- Someone who is in the Federal Inspection Area right now: Each person who may be admissible from one of
 the seven countries, has to have an individual waiver. Processing the waivers may delay the release of the
 individual.
- What about refugees who are considered to be "in transit?"
 - There are currently 872 refugees who are considered to be in transit who are scheduled to arrive in the United States this week. The Secretaries of State and DHS have coordinated and will process the 872 individuals consistent with the terms of the Executive Order, which we've operationalized by assessing each traveler on a case-by-case basis.
- Documents that can be used by citizens identified by the EO to enter the United States are:
 - Any diplomatic visa (A, G, C-2, or NATO)
 - o An I-551 (Green Card)
 - An advance parole document
 - Any SQ immigrant visa

If they are not in possession of one of the above travel documents, they will not be allowed to enter the U.S.

Information for IATA member airlines serving the United States

Dear Jeffrey,

Please see below an important message from Jeffrey Shane, Legal Committee Secretary and IATA General Counsel:

The U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington, in Seattle, today issued a temporary restraining order prohibiting U.S. Customs and Border Protection from implementing or enforcing the January 27 Executive Order establishing new U.S. travel restrictions until the case can be heard and decided on the merits. The case is different from others to date because it was brought by a state government -- the State of Washington – and because the order applies nationwide.

Doug Lavin and I just participated in a conference call with CBP in which the agency confirmed that it will shortly issue a statement saying unequivocally that enforcement of the Executive Order will be suspended immediately and that all travelers who were eligible to travel to the United States prior to its issuance will now be permitted to travel to the United States in keeping with the law as it existed pre-Executive Order. The CBP official on the call said that, as a result of the Seattle TRO, "it is business as usual in terms of entry into the United States" and "it is as if the Executive Order never existed." I asked specifically whether online visa validation systems would reflect the reversal. noting that a great many "do not board" messages seem to be appearing even for passengers protected by earlier court orders. The CBP official said that, in keeping with the Seattle TRO, the State Department has rescinded its revocations of visas. Where a "do not board" message appears, however, airline personnel should act in keeping with the message as it may be attributable to unrelated issues with the traveler.

We have not yet seen a copy of the TRO. It is not clear yet when the court will hear the case. Accordingly, it is difficult to predict with any confidence how long the current suspension will last. For the time being, however, normal (i.e., pre-Executive Order) screening procedures are being restored.

IATA is notifying member airlines of this important development through all of its usual contact lists.



Attached please find the guidance which we have just received from the White House counsel, Donald F. McGahn.

It states in pertinent part (key portion highlighted):

Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.

Attached please find the guidance which we have just received from the White House counsel, Donald F. McGahn.

It states in pertinent part (key portion highlighted):

Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.

SUBJECT: Canadian Landed Immigrants and Executive Order "Protecting the

Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States"

Effective immediately, Canadian Landed Immigrants that are citizens of Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen with a valid U.S. Visa may be considered for an exemption of the 212(f) bar under Section 3(g) of the President's Executive Order if and only if the person satisfies the following conditions:

- 1. Proof to the satisfaction of the inspection Officer of person's Landed Immigrant Status in Canada;
- 2. Possession of a valid U.S. visa;
- 3. Travel that originates in Canada;
- 4. From only a pre-clearance airport; or
- 5. Applying for admission at a land border port of entry;
- 6. And the applicant is otherwise admissible.

The admission of such individuals must be in the national interest of the United States. Prior to any such admission, each individual must be subjected to a thorough examination by an immigration officer, to include CBP conduct of: (b)(7)(E)(b)(7)(E) Each exemption must be considered on a (b)(7)(E)case by case basis with waiver submitted to Commissioner of CBP as previously outlined in the

attached email.
