Effective January 27, 2017, and in accordance with the new Executive Order, Protecting the Nation from Terrorist Attacks by Foreign Nationals, signed by President Trump, all citizens and nationals of; Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen will not be allowed admission into the United States for the next 90 days under Immigration Nationality Act (INA) section 212(f).

This guidance applies to all citizens; non-immigrants, first time immigrants, and refugees from the seven restricted countries. This excludes United States citizens, Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR), and foreign nationals traveling on A's diplomatic visas, North Atlantic Treaty Organization visas, C-2 visas for travel to the United Nations, and G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4 visas or certain diplomatic visas issued by Department of State.

Any Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR), from the seven (7) specific countries that are *also determined to be a positive match to the* (b)(7)(E) are to be denied boarding.

(b)(7)(E)

Special Humanitarian exception is available at the Secretary of Homeland's discretion, all requests for Humanitarian exception will be directed to the XD, DXD, and Director of NTC, through your chain of command. Unless the Director or Assistant Director of NTC has granted boarding permission, no boarding will be authorized.

Any requests for a waiver received from a Port of Entry (POE), involving an LPR that is a *government employee or an active member of the U.S. Armed Forces* must be handled with the highest sense of urgency and elevated to the XD, DXD, and Director of NTC level immediately. High/Low-side checks should be conducted and the results of those checks provided to the Director with the notification.

Any requests for a waiver received from the Department of State (DOS), must also be handled with the highest sense of urgency and elevated to the XD, DXD, and Director of NTC level immediately.

Does this Executive Order apply to green card holders from one of the seven countries listed?

Yes - if the green card holder (a Lawful Permanent Resident, or LPR) was out of the country at the time of the order's signing, or travels out of the country after the order was signed. However, green card holders are eligible for national interest waivers consistent with the provisions of the Executive Order. It does not affect lawful permanent residents who are currently in the country.

They are beginning to doubt if it is wise to cross the border into Mexico for fear that they will be detained and even lose their resident status. This fear is even worst when it comes to Chaldeans and Iranians, two nationalities that come to Tijuana frequently for health care; Some enrolled in legally licensed health plans such as ours, Blue Cross, Aetna, Mediexel, and Cigna. Our first step should be to talk to the Port Director and see what their directive is regarding healthcare tourists, especially those with nationalities of the targeted Countries. I am trying to arrange a meeting with Senator Fienstein , Senator Harris and our congesational delegation in D.C. to get their input and assistance. What can we do at our end?

Implementing President Trump's Executive Order on Protecting the Homeland

To all Department of Homeland Security personnel:

As you have likely seen in the news, it's been a busy weekend for DHS personnel. On Friday, President Trump signed an Executive Order to provide further guidance to DHS on enforcing our immigration laws and to suspend entry into the United States certain classes of foreign nationals in order to ensure our immigration system is working in a way that best protects the safety and security of the American public.

As we worked to implement this Executive Order, a number of court orders were issued based on lawsuits filed in the wake of the order. Upon issuance of the court orders, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) immediately began taking steps to comply with the orders and did so with professionalism.

Concurrently, the Department of Homeland Security continues to work with our partners in the Departments of Justice and State to implement President Trump's Executive Order to protect the Nation from foreign terrorist entry into the United States.

We are committed to ensuring that all individuals affected by the Executive Orders, including those affected by the court orders, are being provided all rights afforded under the law. We are also working closely with airline partners to prevent travelers who would not be granted entry under the Executive Orders from boarding international flights to the United States.

As I said over the weekend, in applying the provisions of the President's Executive Order, the entry of lawful permanent residents is in the national interest. Accordingly, absent significant derogatory information indicating a serious threat to public safety and welfare, lawful permanent resident status will be a dispositive factor in our case-by-case determinations.

We are and will continue enforcing President Trump's Executive Order humanely and with professionalism. We are and will remain in compliance with judicial orders. DHS will continue to protect the homeland.

Thank you to all the men and women on the front lines who worked to implement the President's guidance. You are a credit to your agencies and this Department.

SYNOPSIS:

On January 28, 2017, various U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) ports of entry (POEs) are reporting protests resulting from the Executive Order (EO) "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" issued by President Trump on January 27, 2017. This EO suspended all entry into the United States for aliens who are nationals from Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen as per Section 212(f) of the INA. This includes all non-immigrant classifications, with the exception of those people traveling on diplomatic visas, NATO visas, C2 visas going to the United Nations, G1, G2, G3 and G4 visas. The order also includes all immigrant classes of admission, returning resident aliens, refugees and asylees.

DETAILS:

New York Field Office:

John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK)

UPDATE #2:

- As of 2135 hours, JFK Terminal 4 is reporting that the crowds of protesters are decreasing at this time.

DELEGATION

Authority under Section 3(g) of the Executive Order to issue a visa or other immigration benefits to nationals of countries for which visas and benefits are otherwise blocked under Section 3 of the Executive Order, on a case-by-case basis, and when in the national interest of the United States. Prior to taking any such action, the individual who is the subject of the action must be subjected to a thorough examination by an immigration officer. Pursuant to clarifying and authoritative guidance received from Counsel to the President on February 1, 2017, Sections 3(c) and 3(e) of the Executive Order do not apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States.

Authority under Section 5(e) of the Executive Order to admit individuals to the United States as first-time refugees on a case-by-case basis, but only if the Commissioner (or appropriate designee pursuant to this delegation) and the Secretary of State, or his designee, jointly determine that the admission of such individuals as refugees is in the national interest and would not pose a risk to the security or welfare of the United States. Prior to any such admission as a first-time refugee, each such individual must be subjected to a thorough examination (b)(7)(E)
