Subject: IMMEDIATE ACTION: Executive Order Implementation and compliance with EDNY Court Order

Area Port Directors – just want to update you on the latest guidance on how to process aliens who are subject to the Executive Order. Until further guidance is provided if you encounter a non-immigrant alien subject to the EO, you may consider requesting a waiver from C-1 through the DFO. The port will conduct a (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) consideration for a waiver pursuant to Section 3(g) or 5(a) as appropriate. In considering a waiver you will need to consider if it is in the best interest of the U.S., not granting the waiver would cause an undue hardship or have significant compelling reasons. Examples could include returning students, seeking medical treatment in the U.S., not someone who wants to go to K-Mart for the sales.

If you are considering a waiver please contact the DFO or myself for guidance, I attached an example of the format that will be used to request the waiver. Once the DFO has concurred with the request she will coordinate with HQ to seek approval from C-1 which could take hours to minutes considering the time of day it was requested.

Please continue to send your 3 times a day matrix on time and ensure they are sent to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and myself.

Details:

The plan for the vessel is to attempt to take bunkers (ship's fuel) on the 4th unless the fuel is not available. If the fuel is not available they plan to drift until it's ready. Specifically they do not want to be at anchor for more than 24 hours to avoid having to make U.S. entry.





The airline is only liable to take the alien back from whence they came but given how MX routinely doesn't accept our returns, I would recommend reaching out to ERO to ensure they will accept person and have means and mechanism to remove them from U.S.**

It appears that CBP is prepared to allow (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to enter the United States upon his entry at Sea-Tac airport, under the terms of his previously-issued visa. Furthermore, the CPB team is helpfully prepared to work with the airline carrier to ensure they are aware of (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ability to enter the U.S., so that he is allowed to board his flight.

However, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) physical immigrant visa packet and visa were held in Seattle when he was sent back to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) on Saturday. My understanding is that he is not in possession of a passport, but was relying on these documents for entry and for travel. Furthermore, our understand is that his visa remains listed as "cancelled" in the State Department system. And, because of these things, and given the fact that he has to travel from (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) before continuing on a flight to Seattle, there is a concern that he will not be allowed to board his flight(s), due to the airline or potentially in an issue with European customs in intra-Euro travel.

Can the CPB team assist (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and her client in getting in touch with the State Department to 1) revise his "cancelled" visa status, and 2) obtain a written document that will clearly indicate that his ability to travel from (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to Seattle? Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to

submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.





17 Civ. 480 (AMD)


2. There is imminent danger that, absent the stay of removal, there will be substantial and irreparable injury to refugees, visa-holders, and other individuals from nations subject to the January 27, 2017 Executive Order;
3. The issuance of the stay of removal will not injure the other parties interested in the proceeding;
4. It is appropriate and just that, pending completion of a hearing before the Court on the merits of the Petition, that the Respondents be enjoined and restrained from the commission of further acts and misconduct in violation of the Constitution as described in the Emergency Motion for Stay of Removal.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the respondents, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all members and persons acting in concert or participation with them, from the date of this Order, are

ENJOINED AND RESTRAINED from, in any manner or by any means, removing individuals with refugee applications approved by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services as part of the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program, holders of valid immigrant and non-immigrant visas, and other individuals from Iraq, Syria, Iran, Sudan, Libya, Somalia, and Yemen legally authorized to enter the United States.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that to assure compliance with the Court's order, the Court directs service of this Order upon the United States Marshal for the Eastern District of New York, and further directs the United States Marshals Service to take those actions deemed necessary to enforce the provisions and prohibitions set forth in this Order.

I am contacting you in my capacity as the AILA Washington Chapter CBP Liaison Chair. Could you please describe the impact of the Executive Order signed January 27, 2017, banning entry of Syrian refugees and banning persons from certain countries? We are inquiring so that we can inform our members and the public about who may seek entry. Here are a few specific questions:

- The EO does not name any specific countries, but covers “aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the INA, 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12).” That law only lists Iraq and Syria, but we have heard that 7 countries are covered: Iran, Iraq, Sudan, Somalia, Syria, Yemen and Libya. Which countries are covered?
- Does the EO apply to green card holders?
- Does it apply to persons, with approved nonimmigrant employment status, such as H-1B, L-1, O-1, etc.
- Does it apply to F-1 and OPT authorized students already attending college or working?
- If someone arrives at SeaTac and the EO applies to the person, will they be detained, deemed inadmissible, and then sent back to country from which they came?
- Will CBP exercise parole authority or agree to admit some persons on a case-by-case basis?

We understand that you might not have answers to all of these questions at this time, but we would appreciate having any answers than you can provide. If we are able to share the information, we expect that it could alleviate some burden on you and your staff.

The Department of Homeland Security will continue to enforce all of the president's Executive Orders in a manner that ensures the safety and security of the American people.
