- 2. The understanding is if a non immigrant presents a passport from Canada and birth in Iraq they would be allowed entry if otherwise eligible for admission. Would they still require the vetting process? If a LPR is encountered that is verified to be a Canadian citizen, but born in Iraq are they subject to the EO? POEs should inspect the person in accordance with how they present to the CBP Officer at POE.
- 3. We have a number of charter flights from Detroit to Mexico and the Caribbean. People typically travel for a

week vacation. When we encounter a non immigrant, very often F1 students, who traveled for a short vacation and is now returning to Detroit in the same status they left but are subject to the EO, should they be returned to the location where they traveled to, or processed and turned over to ERO to be removed to their home country? The individuals subject to this EO are barred from entry regardless of where or duration outside the United States. The airline is only liable to take the alien back from whence they came but given how MX routinely doesn't accept our returns, I would recommend reaching out to ERO to ensure they will accept person and have means and mechanism to remove them from U.S.



Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.

A Crisis Action Team from Public Affairs will be working to update the CBP website and their Question & Answer section of the informational page on EO as quickly as possible.



Section 3(c) of the Executive Order entitled "Protecting the Nation from Foreign Terrorist Entry into the United States" (Jan. 27, 2017) suspends for 90 days the entry into the United States of certain aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12). Section 3(e) of the order directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to

submit to the President a list of countries recommended for inclusion on a Presidential proclamation that would prohibit the entry of certain foreign nationals from countries that do not provide information needed to adjudicate visas, admissions, or other benefits under the INA.

I understand that there has been reasonable uncertainty about whether those provisions apply to lawful permanent residents of the United States. Accordingly, to remove any confusion, I now clarify that Sections 3(c) and 3(e) do not apply to such individuals. Please immediately convey this interpretive guidance to all individuals responsible for the administration and implementation of the Executive Order.

petitioner and others similarly situated violates their rights to Due Process and Equal
Protection guaranteed by the United States Constitution;

- There is imminent danger that, absent the stay of removal, there will be substantial and irreparable injury to refugees, visa-holders, and other individuals from nations subject to the January 27, 2017 Executive Order;
- The issuance of the stay of removal will not injure the other parties interested in the proceeding;
- 4. It is appropriate and just that, pending completion of a hearing before the Court on the merits of the Petition, that the Respondents be enjoined and restrained from the commission of further acts and misconduct in violation of the Constitution as described in the Emergency Motion for Stay of Removal.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the respondents, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all members and persons acting in concert or participation with them, from the date of this Order, are

ENJOINED AND RESTRAINED from, in any manner or by any means, removing individuals with refugee applications approved by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services as part of the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program, holders of valid immigrant and non-immigrant visas, and other individuals from Iraq, Syria, Iran, Sudan, Libya, Somalia, and Yemen legally authorized to enter the United States.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that to assure compliance with the Court's order, the Court directs service of this Order upon the United States Marshal for the Eastern District of New York, and further directs the United States Marshals Service to take those actions deemed necessary to enforce the provisions and prohibitions set forth in this Order.

I am contacting you in my capacity as the AILA Washington Chapter CBP Liaison Chair. Could you please describe the impact of the Executive Order signed January 27, 2017, banning entry of Syrian refugees and banning persons from certain countries? We are inquiring so that we can inform our members and the public about who may seek entry. Here are a few specific questions:

- The EO does not name any specific countries, but covers "aliens from countries referred to in section 217(a)(12) of the INA, 8 U.S.C. 1187(a)(12)." That law only lists Iraq and Syria, but we have heard that 7 countries are covered: Iran, Iraq, Sudan, Somalia, Syria, Yemen and Libya. Which countries are covered?
- Does the EO apply to green card holders?
- Does it apply to persons, with approved nonimmigrant employment status, such as H-1B, L-1, O-1, etc.
- Does it apply to F-1 and OPT authorized students already attending college or working?
- If someone arrives at SeaTac and the EO applies to the person, will they be detained, deemed
 inadmissible, and then sent back to country from which they came?
- Will CBP exercise parole authority or agree to admit some persons on a case-by-case basis?

We understand that you might not have answers to all of these questions at this time, but we would appreciate having any answers than you can provide. If we are able to share the information, we expect that it could alleviate some burden on you and your staff.





The Department of Homeland Security will continue to enforce all of the president's Executive Orders in a manner that ensures the safety and security of the American people. The president's Executive Orders remain in place—prohibited travel will remain prohibited, and the U.S. government retains its right to revoke visas at any time if required for national security or public safety. The president's Executive Order affects a minor portion of international travelers, and is a first step towards reestablishing control over America's borders and national security.

Approximately 80 million international travelers enter the United States every year. Yesterday, less than one percent of the more than 325,000 international air travelers who arrive every day were inconvenienced while enhanced security measures were implemented. These individuals went through enhanced security screenings and are being processed for entry to the United States, consistent with our immigration laws and judicial orders.

The Department of Homeland Security will faithfully execute the immigration laws, and we will treat all of those we encounter humanely and with professionalism. No foreign national in a foreign land, without ties to the United States, has any unfettered right to demand entry into the United States or to demand immigration benefits in the United States.

The Department of Homeland Security will comply with judicial orders; faithfully enforce our immigration laws, and implement the president's Executive Orders to ensure that those entering the United States do not pose a threat to our country or the American people.
